City Trucks will make special trash pickup on these days. All items MUST be out at the curb by 8 a.m. on your regular route day

All types of trash will be picked up on your regular trash route day EXCEPT yard waste, tires, E-waste, and household hazardous waste. Yard waste will be picked up on your regular yard waste route day beginning April 27, and must be in a solid container. There will be a \$10.00 charge per item for appliances with freon. Tree limbs must be cut no longer than 8 feet long. Fireplace ash must be in plastic bags.

The maximum limit the City will pick up at each residence is one load of household items and one load of tree limbs. Normal household trash will be picked up in the usual man-

SPECIAL NOTE: TRASH MUST BE SEPARATED, i.e., tree limbs from metals, etc. since they are disposed of in different locations at the landfill. Mattresses and furniture must be separate from other trash. Hazardous waste (paint, motor oil, batteries, pesticides, poisons, caustic chemicals, etc.) and E-waste (computers, phones, microwaves, stereos, TVs, DVDs, VCRs) <u>WILL NOT</u> be picked up and should be taken by owners directly to the

NOTE: Twice-a-week pickup begins the week of APRIL 25. Regular household trash will be picked up on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Yard waste will be picked up on Wednesday afternoon and Thursday, and must be in a solid container. Recyclables will be picked up on Fridays. All items must be placed at the curb by 8:00 a.m. on your designated route day.
