

JV golfers win tourney title

The Norton Community High School junior varsity golfers had their best outing of the season on Tuesday when they won the championship of the Smith Center JV Invitational Tournament.

Playing in what Norton head golf coach David Stover called perfect conditions on the Smith Center course, the Blue Jay golfers produced a four-person team score of 195.

They were followed by Thomas More Prep-Marian of Hays, 200; Phillipsburg, 205; Smith Center,

212; Belleville, 213; Beloit, 231; Concordia, 238; Plainville, 242; Smith Center 2, 266; Osborne, 267.

Norton senior Josh Asbury was low medalist for the tournament with a 45. He was followed by junior Taylor Meder, 48; sophomore Cassius Dole, 51; sophomore Dustan Daniels, 51.

Senior Katie Gall also played for Norton and scored a 61.

today was no exception. I am very pleased with the progress of all our golfers up to this point and look forward to seeing what they can accomplish for the rest of the season."

The Northern Valley High School track team competed at their Husky Invitational last Friday. Eight teams competed. The Husky girls placed eighth overall with three points, and the Husky boys placed second overall with 118 points, just ten points behind first place winners, Hill City.

The Northern Valley Lady Husky Haley Graham earned all her team's points. She threw the discus 75'75" for sixth place. She then threw the shot put 26'4.5 "to capture fifth and lastly, she threw the javlin 56 feet 9 inches for eighth place.

In action for the boys, Tyler Montgomery took fifth in the high jump with 5'6" followed by Hunter Chandler in seventh with 5'4".

In the men's pole vault, Matt Dole placed fourth with a vault of 10'6".

In the long jump, Austin Herman took second with a jump of 19'11.5" followed by Jordan Baird in fifth with 17'6.05".

Joran Baird placed seventh in the triple jump with 36'6.5" followed by Tyson Callaway in eighth with 36'.

Dillon Hogan placed sixth in the discus throw with 106'6.5". In the javlin throw, Dillon Ho-

gan placed sixth by throwing 128'2.5" followed by Ian Vincent in seventh with 125'01" and Zachary Vincent in eighth with 124'6".

The 4x800 meter relay team of Chandler, Tharman, Montgomery and Lowry placed second with a time of 9:57.79.

Tyson Callaway took a first place win in the 110 meter hurdles with a time of 17:50.

Gunnar Hays had another first for the Huskies in the 1600 meter run with a time of 4:53.50.

The 4x100 meter relay team of Z. Vincent, Chandler, Baird and Tharman took second place with a time of 47:18.

Austin Herman placed second in the 400 meter dash in 55:03.

Tyson Callaway won the 300 meter hurdles for the Huskies in a time of 45.50.

In the 800 meter run, Colton Lowry won the race with a time of 2:06.07 followed by Hunter Chandler in fifth with 2:26.98.

Gunnar Hays won the 3200 meter run in a time of 10:32.43 followed by Jon Compton in second with 11:34.49.

The 4x400 meter relay team of Herman, Baird, Callaway and Lowry placed second with a time of 3:52.45.

Northern Valley junior high track teams win

The junior high boys and girls from Northern Valley each captured first place at the 25th annual Husky track meet that was held in Hill City last Thursday. It was the first time since 1994 that both teams won first place in the same year.

Boys Seventh and Eighth Grade Results

The boys won first over all, first in six events and second in eleven other events. Six teams competed in the meet, and Northern Valley had 194 points.

In the 100 meter dash, Phillip Bryant took first with a time of 12.4 followed by teammate Gabriel Anderson in second in 13.0.

Phillip Bryant also took first in the 200 meter run in a time of 26.2 followed by teammate Eli Lowry in second with 27.3.

Eli Lowry then placed first in the 400 meter dash with a time of 1:02.9.

In the 800 meter run, Brant Cox got second in a time of 2:50.7 followed by teammate Macy Kasson in third in 2:55.0.

Stewart Whitney placed second in the 1600 meter run with a time of 5:51.6 followed by Brant Cox in third with 5:59.6.

The Huskies had three place in the 100 meter hurdles. Clint Cole got second in 18.0 followed by Matt Stutsman in third with 18.0 and Macy Kasson in sixth

in 19.3.

Phillip Bryant won the triple jump by jumping 35 feet 8 inches.

In the discus throw, Clint Cole placed second with a throw of 93 feet 5 inches followed by Stewart Whitney in fourth with 91 feet six inches.

Stewart Whitney then placed second in the shot put by throwing 36 feet 4 inches followed by Carson Montgomery in fourth with 30 feet one inch and Ame Baird with 28 feet 10 inches.

The Northern Valley boys dominated the long jump. Phillip Bryant won with a jump of 17 feet 9 inches followed by Phillip Rupp's second place finishing jump of 14 feet 3 inches.

In the pole vault, Eli Lowry reached 9 feet to win second followed by Clint Cole's third place jump of 8 feet and Gabriel Anderson's fifth place vault of 6 feet 6 inches.

Clint Cole came back to take second in the high jump hitting 5 feet to tie teammate Eli Lowry who took third at 5 feet. Matt Stutsman placed sixth with a jump of 4 feet 8 inches.

The 400 meter relay team of Rupp, Whitney, Stutsman and Anderson took second with a time of 57.3.

The 800 meter relay team of Rupp, Kasson, Thraikill and Anderson won the race in 1:59.0.

In the Medley Relay, Northern Valley's team of Florence, Kas-

son, Rupp and Thraikill placed fifth in a time of 2:11.3.

Boys Sixth Grade Team Results

There were six teams competing and these boys took fifth overall with 45 points.

Carson Wallace took first with a high jump of 4 feet 4 inches followed by Damian Wellman in fourth at 3 feet 8 inches.

Carson Wallace took second in the 200 meter run in a time of 31.5 followed by Johnathon Towery in sixth in a time of 33.5.

Towery then placed fourth in the 400 meter dash with a time of 1:15.0.

In the 800 meter run, Carson Wallace took second in 2:53.9 followed by Johnathon Towery in third with 2:57.7 and Damian Wellman in fourth in 3:30.5.

Girls Seventh and Eighth Grade Results

The ladies team won first over their five opponents with 119 points. They took first in five events and second in five events.

Brooke Baird won the 100 meter hurdles in 17.5 followed by Kortney Cunningham in fourth with a time of 19.2.

Talia Lowry placed fourth in the 100 meter dash in 15.0 followed by Elexsa Anderson in fifth in 15.0.

Brooke Baird placed third in the 200 meter run in 31.6. Then she won the 400 meter dash in 1:09.9.

Kirsten Burger won the 800

meter run in 2:50.1 then won the 1600 meter run in 6:07.4 followed by Allison Keith in fourth in 7 minutes flat.

Shayna Vincent placed sixth in the shot put with a throw of 30 feet 4 inches.

In the discus throw Khrianna VanPatten took second with a throw of 77 feet one inch followed by Brianna Martin in fifth with 64 feet 3 inches and Shayna Vincent in sixth with 63 feet 10 inches.

Brooke Baird won the pole vault by vaulting 6 feet.

Kortney Cunningham placed second in three events in a row, the long jump with a jump of 13 feet 6 inches, the high jump with a jump of 4 feet 10 inches and lastly, the triple jump with 29 feet 4 inches.

The 400 meter relay team of Lowry, Smith, Anderson and Burger placed second in a time of 1:02.0.

The 800 meter relay team of Vincent, Anderson, Lowry and Smith placed fourth in 2:16.4.

Lastly, the medley relay team of Lowry, Smith, Burger and Anderson placed sixth with a time of 2:24.4.
