My first job at the Norton Telegram was putting together a Norton County Fair book in the back room of the Telegram office for Wilson-Carter Printers. That was in 1971.

Vicki said, when I started as a typist we typed on teletype machines. You typed on a tape, fed the tape into a machine that read the type and printed out your copy.
