

Track season is over for junior varsity team

Most of the Norton Community High School junior varsity track and field members had their final season competition on Monday when they competed in the varsity Hill City Invitational Track Meet.

"Our girls and boys did a nice job in this meet," said Norton head track and field coach Jason Jones. "Though this was a varsity meet, we sent a limited junior varsity. For most of them, this was their final meet of the season."

"This gave them a chance to compete late in the season and work towards personal records. They had fun competing, bettered themselves and scored some points. We are proud of how they conducted themselves."

"We are extremely proud of the efforts of these athletes at this meet and of the hard work they have given all season. A few of them will continue to compete for us in the league meet on Friday."

Those who will not go to league got better and competed very hard, right up to their season's end.

"They had a great season and we can't wait to see them back competing for us next track season."

Hoxie won the girls team championship with 103 points, followed by Hill City, 95; Plainville, 90; Quinter, 89; Trego Community, 86; Ellis, 63; Smith Center, 20; Norton, 5.

Boys team champion was Hill City with 116 points, followed by Quinter, 106; Plainville, 105; Hoxie, 89; Ellis, 66; Smith Center, 42; Trego Community, 19; Norton, 7.

Norton sophomore Antjelica Pfannenstiel placed fifth in the 300 meter hurdles in 57.75 and Lady Jay sophomore Stephanie Hager finished fifth in the 1600 meter run in 6:56.65.

Pfannenstiel also placed sixth in the 100 meter hurdles with a

time of 19.62.

Husky track team takes first at Logan

On May 4, the Northern Valley High School boys track team attended the Logan Invitational Track Meet and won first place with 129 points.

The 400 meter relay team of Zach Vincent, Hunter Chandler, Jordan Baird and Alex Tharman placed fifth in 48:75.

The 1600 meter relay team of Austin Herman, Phillip Compton, Baird and Colton Lowry won the race in a time of 3:44.0.

The 3200 meter relay team of Chandler, Tyler Montgomery, Tharman and Lowry took first with a time of 9:27.63.

In the 110 meter hurdles Tyson Callaway placed second with a time of 18:03.

Then Callaway won the 300 meter hurdles in 45:24.

Austin Herman took fourth in the 400 meter dash with a time of 54:34.

The Huskies dominated the 800 meter run, Lowry won the race in 2:07.1 followed by Phillip Compton in second with 2:21.19 and Hunter Chandler in fourth with 2:24.39.

Gunnar Hays won the 1600 meter run in 4:47.0 followed by Jon Compton in third with a time of 5:23.25.

Hays also won the 3200 meter run in 10:21.47 followed by J. Compton in second with 11:35.31 and Steven Brown in sixth in a time of 14:59.89.

Austin Herman won the triple jump with a distance of 40'10" and then took third in the long jump measuring 19'5.5".

Hunter Chandler placed fifth in the high jump at 5'10".

Matt Dole took fourth in the pole vault, reaching a height of 10'6".

Nate Land placed fifth in the discus with a throw of 116'5.5". Z. Vincent threw the javelin

131'7" to place fourth.

Head coach Chuck Fessenden said, "We were happy to see our boys place first at the Logan Invitational. We were able to score some big points in the 800, 1600 and 3200. Gunner Hays ran two exceptional races. His time in the 3200 broke a meet record that had stood for over twenty years. Colton Lowry and Austin Herman continue to perform well in their events. Tyler Montgomery, Alex Tharman and Hunter Chandler all ran good splits in the 3200 meter relay. Tyson Callaway recorded

a personal best in a very close race in the 300 hurdles. Hunter Chandler had some great jumps in the high jump and was able to set a personal record at 5'10". Phillip Compton made his return from surgery and helped us out in the 800 and 1600 meter relays. Jon Compton also turned in some good performances in the 1600 and 3200. Our weight people continue to show improvement. Zach Vincent threw a personal best in the javelin. In the discus, Nate Land set a personal best for the second meet in a row."
