

Norton wrestler signs letter of intent to attend Pratt Community College

"Tug" wrestled at 160 pounds and compiled a 36-2 record his senior season. His four-year career record is 123-38. He ranks No. 5 among career wins by Norton wrestlers in the coach Bill Johnson era.

This season, Keiswetter led his team in takedowns with 74, escapes with 19, technical falls with 5 and team points with 183. He was second in major decisions with 5, second in falls with 19, third in 3-point near falls with 17 and third in 2-point near falls

"Tug" was named co-"Most Outstanding Wrestler" of the Norton team this year by the Blue Jay coaches.

As a member of the Class 3-2-1A Regional Wrestling Cham-

pionship Team, Keiswetter was named to the Kansas Wrestling Coaches Association All-Academic State Championship Wrestling Team.

"'Tug' dominated his weight class the last two years," said Norton head wrestling coach Bill Johnson.

"His style is well-rounded. He can wrestle leg attacks and upper

"He won't be overwhelmed by the upper weight college muscle men. He's always going forward and dominates his opponent with under hooks and upper body

"He is a good student, as well."

"Landon is what every coach wants on his team: a winner both as an individual and with the team aspect," said Josh Carroll, head wrestling coach at Pratt Community College.

"I really enjoy his wrestling style and his intensity. One thing I really look at when watching kids compete is how do they approach

the match and Landon goes out for one reason and that is to get the win.

"The reason I recruited Landon was a very easy one. In my head, I feel like he was the best 160 pound wrestler in the state this year. I really see a lot of bright spots in his future competing at this level for All-American honors and, hopefully, a national title while

Landon "Tug" Keiswetter was also an outstanding football player for Norton Community High School. In addition to being a four-year wrestling letterman, he lettered three years in football, where he was an offensive guard and linebacker. The leading tackler for the Blue Jays, he was named All-Mid-Continent League on both offense and defense as well as receiving All-State recognition from the large daily newspapers in the state and the Kansas Football Coaches As-
