nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The Norton Community High School girls track and field team was the runner-up and the Blue Jay boys track and field team placed third in the annual Mid-Continent League Track Meet on Friday in Phillipsburg.

Smith Center won the girls championship with 128 points, followed by Norton, 115; Phillipsburg, 96; Plainville, 61; Hill City, 56; Osborne, 39; Trego Community, 38; Ellis, 18; Stock-

The boys champion was Phillipsburg with 118 points, barely edging runner-up Osborne, who scored 116.5. Norton's third place point total was 94, followed by Plainville, 71; Smith Center, 51; Hill City, 49; Ellis, 35; Stockton, 21.5; Trego Community, 2.

"Our athletes got off the bus, tered themselves in a number of ways," said Norton head track and field coach Jason Jones. "We are extremely proud of their efforts and performances. Great things happened for us throughout the day's competition.

"The teams which outscored us are very solid teams. We continued to improve in many areas, setting 21 new personal records on a very windy, cool day! We love to see these performances at this point in the season and we will work to continue to improve our marks as we head into Regionals and State over the next

"We could not be more proud of our girls and boys and the manner in which they prepared, competed and conducted themselves. We are eager to enter our next competition with our best efforts and see what we can make happen at Regionals!"

GIRLS

The Lady Jays had two individual gold medal winners. Sophomore Teslee Nickell heaved the shot a personal best distance of 41'1.5" to win that event and freshman Bailey Ambrosier cleared 9' in the pole vault to win

Norton's 4 x 800 meter remedals when they finished first in 10:55.96.

Norton scored 22 points in the pole vault. In addition to Ambrosier's performance, Jones placed runner-up with a personal best

Marisa Maddy cleared 7'6" to finish in fourth place.

Blue Jays runner-up, third

Norton also tallied 18 points in the 3200 meter run. Junior Astrid Moen was runner-up in 12:59.59, followed by freshman Darcy Bainter, personal best 13:07.51 for third and sophomore Julia Kent, 13:51.30 for fourth.

Ambrosier scored in four events. In addition to her pole vault and relay successes, Ambrosier was runner-up in the 400 meter dash in 1:05.59 and was a member of the foursome which placed runner-up in the 4 x 400 meter relay in 4:22.40. Running with her in that relay were junior Erin Terrell, Sprigg and

Sprigg won her third medal of the day with a runner-up finish in the 800 meter run in 2:37.90 and also earned a point with a sixth place in the triple jump with a distance of 31'3.5".

Engelbert scored points in three events. In addition to her two relay medals, she finished just behind Ambrosier in the 400 meter dash to win the bronze medal with a clocking of 1:05.71.

Terrell also finished third in the 300 meter hurdles with a personal record time of 54.08. Sophomore Antjelica Pfannenstiel placed fifth in the 300 hurdles with a personal best time of 55.10.

Sophomore Alec Melvin placed third in the shot put with a distance of 35'5.75" and Bainter finished third in the 1600 meter run in 6:08.86. Moen was sixth in the 1600 meter run in 6:19.58.

Norton's 4 x 100 meter relay team of sophomore Katherine Boteler, freshman Marisa Maddy, freshman Johnnye Ruder and Terrell placed sixth in 57.12.

Melvin placed sixth in the discus with a throw of 101'7" and Jones was sixth in the long jump with a leap of 14'6.5".

The Norton boys also had two individual gold medal winners along with a gold medal winning relay team.

Junior Seth Antrim won the pole vault by clearing a personal best height of 13'6" and junior Zach Hartwell hit the tape first in the 3200 meter run in 10:57.23.

The Blue Jay foursome of senior Troy Bainter, Hartwell, junior Bryan Henry and junior Tye Nickell won the gold in the 4 x 800 meter relay with a clocking of 8:55.02.

Norton sophomore Jacob Brooks scored points in four events. He was runner-up in the high jump with a personal best clearance of 6', runner-up in the 200 meter dash in 23.30, fourth in the 100 meter dash in 11.50 and anchored the Blue Jays' 4 x 100 meter relay team to a fifth place finish in 46.86. Running with him were freshman Austin Hager, senior Billy Broeckelman and junior Trey Millan.

Brooks missed a gold medal in the 200 meter dash by four hundredths of a second. Smith Center's Truitt Kuhlmann won the race in 23.27.

Henry tallied points in three events. In addition to running on the gold medal winning 4 x 800 meter relay team, he placed third in the 400 meter dash in 55.08 and anchored the 4 x 400 meter relay team to a sixth place finish in 3:51.79. Running with him in that relay were Nickell, Broeckelman and junior Dillon McConney.

Bainter finished third in the 800 meter run in 2:14.06. Finishing right behind him in a personal record time of 2:14.51 was sophomore John Renner.

Broeckelman placed third in the pole vault with a personal record height of 12'6".

Freshman Alec Hager placed fourth in the 3200 meter run in 11:52.72.

Millan finished fourth in the 200 meter dash with a personal best time of 24.61 and junior Jordan Wahlmeier placed fourth in the triple jump with a distance of 38'8.75". Wahlmeier also placed sixth in the 300 meter hurdles with a personal best clocking of 45.97.

Junior Casey Temmel heaved

the shot a personal best distance of 42'2" to place fifth in that event and freshman Trever Lewis finished fifth in the triple jump with a distance of 36'11.5".
