Local athletes show off skills at Pitch, Hit and Run Sectionals

On April 30, the Norton Recreation Commission sponsored their 3rd annual local Aquafina Pitch, Hit and Run competition. The event had twelve winners that were able to progress to the Sectional competition that was held in Plainville on Saturday, May 14.

The day was windy and cold but the enthusiasm was not dampened. The event coincided with the Little Kids track meet held in Norton, but arrangements were made to allow the Norton students to attend both events.

The participants competed in six pitches for accuracy, the best of three hits off the tee for accuracy and distance and a timed run from second base to home plate. Points were awarded based on the conversion chart numbers coinciding with the results of with 50 points in pitching; 208 in each competition. Eight Norton students placed in the Sectional competition.
