

Norton Junior Jays take second and third

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On May 4, the Norton eighth grade track team attended the Plainville track meet. The girls' team took second place with 88 points and the boys' team took third with 113 points.

Eighth Grade Girls Results

Sierra Griffith took second in the 800 meter run in a time of 2:58.31 followed by Jesika Smith in fifth with 3:09.18.

Jesika Smith also took third in the 1600 meter run in 6:56.50.

Sierra Griffith placed second

in the 3200 meter run with a time of 15:30.00, and then she placed third in the 100 meter hurdles with 18:09.

Kaitylyn Bohl took second in the high jump with a height of 4'4".

Kenzie Esslinger won the pole vault with a height of 8'0" followed by Adrienne Hager in second at 7'0".
