Proverbs 10: 7 tells us, "The memory of the righteous will be a blessing, but the name of the wicked will rot."

A study was done on a man who lived in the late 1700s, Max Jukes. He lived in the state of New York and he refused to take his children to church even when they asked to go. Max's decision was very destructive to his family and costly to the state of New York. Max had 903 known descendants. One hundred were sent to prison for an average term of thirteen years, ninety were public prostitutes, one hundred forty-five were admitted alcoholics, two hundred eighty-five had social diseases, and three hundred were delinquents. The report estimated that the crimes and care of the Max Jukes' family line cost the state of New York over one million dollars.

Many fathers today are like Max. They do not follow Christ and they see no value in Christian training. Some even invent ways or make excuses for keeping their family from the true things of God.

Fathers, God gives you this day an opportunity to choose your family's legacy. Will you choose Christ as your own Savior and Lord? Will you then seriously take up the instruction of the Lord to "Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." (Proverbs 22:6)

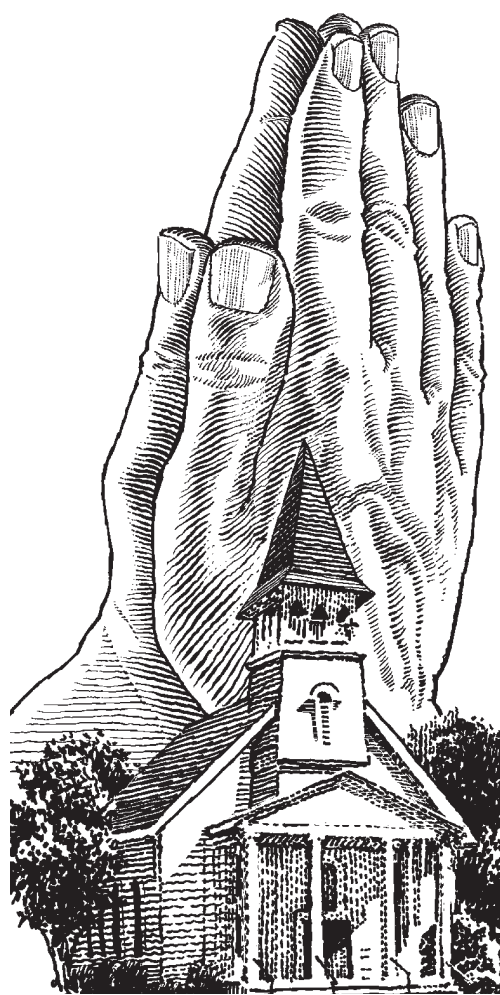
