A Norton County man has been taken into custody after his part in a standoff situation that occurred in the early morning hours Sunday in the city of Edmond.

After he broke into the home of his mother and refused to leave, officers apprehended Mitch Kachel, 27, and have charged him with Criminal Trespassing and Criminal Damage to Property. Norton County Sheriff Troy Thomson reported Monday morning that his office received a call of a domestic situation at 3:23 a.m. Sunday. The caller reported that a man had broken into her house with a shotgun and she was able to hide from him and call 911. Upon arrival, officers learned that the intruder was the woman's son, who did not have permission to be there. "I was able to make contact with the suspect on the phone and he refused to come out of the house," Thomson said. "He wasn't belligerent or threatening, he just refused to come out of

the house."

Over approximately two hours, officers of the Norton County Sheriff's Office, Norton Police Department, Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks, and Lenora EMS stayed on the scene and attempted to lure Kachel out of the home, who became quieter over time.

Kachel was booked into the Norton County Jail on charges of Criminal Trespassing and Criminal Damage to property, but additional charges are pending a full investigation into the incident.

"We're glad that everyone is safe in a potentially bad situation," Thomson said. "I appreciate the officers and agencies that responded to the scene and helped everything go smoothly."

Norton USD 211 to hold late-start day this week

In transitioning to the new Multi-Tiered Systems of Support schedule, the Norton Community School District will hold a series of four late-start days during the current school year, with the first late-start planned for tomorrow (Wednesday). School will begin at 10:30 a.m.

For the late start days, no breakfast will be served at the school and busses will run on their normal routes, two hours later than usual. School will dismiss at normal times.

According to information from Norton USD 211, the district is preparing to transition to the new system, which will group students for intensive instruction in areas of need, including math and reading. Transitioning to the system requires significant training for school personnel, which will take place on the late-start mornings.
