Norton can't stop Smith Center in league play

nortontelegam@nwkansas.com Coach Lucas Melvin's Norton Community High School football team slowed but couldn't stop Smith Center's efficient wishbone offense Friday in Smith Center and the result was a 58-20 Mid-Continent League

The first half was close, ending 24-14 in favor of the Redmen but they outscored the visiting Blue Jays 34-6 after intermission.

Smith Center drove downfield to score the first two times they had the ball. Junior back Kyler Atwood scored from 2 yards out with 9:27 left and senior Alex Hobelmann ran for 2 extra points. Their second touchdown came on a 10 yard run by senior back Truitt Kuhlmann and senior Aaron Sellars ran for 2 extra points to make it 16-0 with 3:44 left.

A fumbled punt stopped the Redmen on their third possession but Norton could not score until after a second Smith Center fumble on their 21. Senior quarterback Jordan Wahlmeier scored on a 3-yard run and sophomore Austin Hager's kick made the score 16-7 with 25 seconds left in the first period.

Norton junior Eli Bozarth made a big play in the second quarter when he stripped the ball from a Smith Center player and dashed 34 yards to paydirt! Hager's kick split the uprights and Norton had cut the Redman lead to 16-14 with 9:00 left in the half.

Smith Center continued to eat up yardage, however, and scored again with 3:28 remaining when Atwood ran 5 yards. Kuhlmann ran for 2 extra points, making the score 24-14.

Norton stopped another Smith Center drive but an intercepted Wahlmeier pass kept the Blue Jays from scoring before half-

The Blue Jays were unable to move the ball in the third quarter and Smith Center scored on runs of 40 yards, 61 yards and 2 yards by Kuhlmann, a 2 point conversion by Sellars and extra point kick by Kale Terrill to extend their lead to 45-14.

Kuhlmann scored his fifth touchdown on a 4 yard run and Atwood tallied from 4 yards out and Terrill kicked 1 of 2 extra point tries as the Redmen extended their lead to 58-14 in the fourth quarter.

Norton's final touchdown came on a 24-yard keeper by Wahlmeier with 57 seconds left to make the final 58-20.

Smith Center dominated the statistics, rolling up 441 yards rushing for a 6.3 yard average. Norton gained 116 yards and averaged a reasonable 3.9 yards but had half as many attempts.

Norton punted 6 times and Smith Center did not punt. The Redmen fumbled 4 times and lost 3; the Blue Jays did not fumble.

Norton was penalized 10 times for 68 yards and Smith Center was flagged 5 times for

Coach's comments

"Our defense was out there way too long," said coach Melvin. "And our offense didn't do much. We had several dropped passes that really hurt; our receivers were probably nervous. We didn't execute our offense very well. Their defense was stunting and blitzing quite a bit, which caused some of that.

"Although we played hard on defense, we have to be more disciplined in carrying out our assignments.

"We played hard but we just have to get tougher and work on our mistakes this week."

Second quarter

Atwood got nothing, Lambert got 6, Lambert ran to the 26 for a first down. Lane Bigge tackled Hobelmann after 4, Kuhlmann ran to the Norton 34. The next down, Eli Bozarth stripped the Redman back of the pigskin and raced untouched into the end zone! Hager split the uprights and Norton was within 2 points of the Redmen at 16-14 with 9:00 left in the first half.

Hobelmann returned Hager's kickoff to the Smith Center 28. Atwood gained 3, Hobelmann ran to the Smith Center 42. Kuhlmann got to the Norton 49 before Nickell and Dalton Miller tackled him. Atwood ran to the Norton 43 for a first down. Damian Davis tackled Kuhlmann after 5. Smith Center gained 2, Kuhlmann lost 3, Norton was offsides and lost 5, Smith Center got a first down on the 32, then gained 6 more. Kuhlmann ran to the Norton 14, Atwood plunged to the 11, Kuhlmann was tackled on the 9 by McKenna. Norton was offsides; Atwood drove 5 yards for a touchdown. Kuhlmann ran for 2 and Smith Center led 24-14 at offsides and lost 5, a pass was incomplete and Dillon McConney punted.

The ball was downed on the Norton 37. Sellars got 3, Kuhlman ran to the 26, Atwood got 3, a host of Norton tacklers threw a Redman for a loss but a pass over the middle to Louis Frazier was good for a first down on the Norton 7-yard line. Smith Center fumbled but recovered; Hobelmann ran the keeper to the 2, Atwood got 0 but Kuhlmann ran into the end zone to score. Terrill kicked the extra point, making it 45-14 at 2:47.

Nickell returned the kickoff to the Smith Center 45. Brooks ran to the 37 on 2 plays but a personal foul cost Norton yardage back to their 47. Austin Hager ran to the Redman 45 but Wahlmeier was sacked and Smith Center took over the ball.

A host of Norton tacklers threw Sellars for a 2 yard loss but Kuhlmann ran to the Norton 31 and Sellars to the 26 as the quarter ended with the Redmen leading 45-14.

Fourth quarter

Atwood plunged to the 23, then ran to the 10 and to the 8. Kuhlmann scored from there. Casey Temmel blocked the extra point attempt but the Redmen led 51-14 at 9:58.

Nickell returned the kickoff to the Norton 38. Brooks gained 2, Norton was penalized 5 for illegal procedure, Jared Bohl ran for 1. Kody Molzahn intercepted a Wahlmeier pass on the Norton 35. Atwood gained 12, then 3, Trevor Overmiller gained 11, Atwood got 3, a host of tacklers stopped Overmiller for nothing, Norton was offsides and lost 5, Atwood ran 4 yards for a touchdown. Terrill kicked the extra point, making it 58-14 at 5:17.

Nickell returned the kickoff to the Norton 35. Hager gained Smith Center 42. Wahlmeier ran for a first down on the Redman 27. Hager gained 3, then Wahlmeier ran a keeper for a 24-yard touchdown. The extra point kick was wide and the game ended early due to the continuous clock with Smith Center earning a 58-20 win.

Next action

Norton will play an unfamiliar foe whom they have never played in history when they host Perryton, Texas this Friday night at Travis Field with kickoff set for 7 p.m.

Perryton is a larger school than Norton with an enrollment similar to a large 4A or small 5A school in Kansas. They have a current record of 2-3.

"They will be an excellent football team," said coach Melvin. "It's a one-time opportunity for our young men to play a team from Texas. We're telling them to go out and have fun, do their best and see what happens."


Coach Melvin said Perryton has several 350 pound linemen. They run a spread offense with an athletic quarterback and receivers and a good running
