Coach Lucas Melvin's Norton Community High School football team scored 30 points in their last District game of the season on Thursday night at Travis Field in Norton, which would be enough to win many games, but the visiting Phillipsburg Panthers put 57 on the scoreboard to win and advance to the playoffs.

Phillipsburg scored touchdowns on all three possessions of the first quarter. Norton scored their first touchdown when Jacob Brooks recovered a Panther fumble and senior fullback Trey Millan tallied from 3 yards out with time running out, making the score 21-7 after one period.

Phillipsburg scored one touchdown and kicked a field goal in the second quarter. Norton put together a 70-yard touchdown drive late in the second quarter. Senior quarterback Jordan Wahlmeier scored from 9 yards out and sophomore kicker Austin Hager kicked the extra point to make the score 30-14 at halftime.

A 44-yard touchdown run by Wahlmeier to start the second half cut the Panther lead to 30-20 but Phillipsburg added two more touchdowns and Norton's only other points came on a safety as the third period ended with the score 44-22.

Phillipsburg scored one more touchdown early in the fourth quarter but tallied on two more field goals. Norton scored their final touchdown when junior wide receiver Jacob Brooks made a one-handed grab of a pass from Wahlmeier and sprinted down the sidelines 40 yards to the end zone. Wahlmeier ran for two extra points, making the final score 57-30.

Coach's comments

"Phillipsburg was one of the better teams we played this year," said coach Melvin. "They were quick and their line was tough and more physical than us. We just couldn't stop them. We were out of place at times on defense. It's all about being disciplined.

"Offensively, we did okay. We played hard but just didn't score enough."
