improperly by disposing of large items such as bed frames, televisions, engine parts and hazardous waste like paint and household chemicals.

While no plans have been made to remove those dumpsters,

Lawson encouraged citizens to dispose of those items properly. That may require contacting the county landfill for proper disposal recommendations and drop-off at the landfill.

"We want to keep our city and county as clean as possible,"

Lawson said. "We want to make recycling as easy as possible and make this transition as easy as possible for our citizens and we appreciate our good working relationship with the county to help make that happen."
