## Norton JV Wrestling season opens with victory at Alma tournament

The Norton Community High School second team wrestlers opened the 2011-12 season on Monday evening with an impressive championship finish in the varsity Alma Invitational Tour-

The Blue Jays scored 127 points to easily outdistance runner-up Overton, who scored 89 points. They were followed by Wilcox Hildreth, 80; Pleasanton, 74; Hitchock Co.-Wauneta Palisade, 72; Eustis Farnam, 40; Alma, 39; Southern Valley, 37; Unattached, 14.

All ten Norton wrestlers placed in the tourna-

Winning championships were freshman Caysean Campbell, 106; freshman Dalton Vanover, 120; freshman Jared Tallent, 132; and freshman Stewart Whitney, 160.

Placing runner-up were sophomore Toby Nickell, 138; freshman Kendall Miller, 145 and freshman Lance Armbrister, 182. In third place were freshman Derek Rowh, 126 and freshman Christian Boser, 152. Finishing in fourth place was sophomore Garret Otter, 113.

#### **Coach's comments**

"Even though some brackets were small, the Alma Invitational is a good tournament for our second team to begin competition," said Norton assistant wrestling coach Shane Miller. "Our second team, composed of eight freshmen and two sophomores, competed very well in this varsity round robin tournament.

"In the lower weights, Caysean Campbell and Garret Otter were in four and five man round robins, respectively. Garret finished 2-3 for fourth place while Caysean went 4-0 to win the gold medal at 106 pounds. Caysean had three pins and,

in the finals, had a dominant 7-0 decision over Linemann of Alma. Dalton Vanover was in some exciting matches as well at 120. Dalton opened the tournament with a high scoring comeback to win 15-11. If that wasn't enough, he trailed in his second match and again had a late rally for the

"Our middleweights will be very competitive as well. Due to the competition being on Monday after being postponed from Saturday, several of our boys bumped up a weight class. Nebraska State qualifiers challenged Jared Tallent, Toby Nickell and Kendall Miller. Jared opened the tournament with an exciting 4-3 win over state qualifier and No.1 seed Ethan Enochs of Overton. Jared finished the remainder of the day with two pins.

"After a year away from the sport, Toby Nickell started his high school wrestling career with a close 3-0 loss to state qualifier KC Defillips of Overton. Toby also finished the tournament with two second period pins.

At 145, Kendall Miller started the tournament with a dominating 15-5 decision over his opponent from Hitchcock County and lost a hard fought battle to state medalist Aaron Winberg of Pleasanton.

"I was very excited for Stewart Whitney and Lance Armbrister. Stewart has never wrestled before this year and Lance had limited action in junior high. Lance went 1-1 for a second place finish and Stewart wrestled the best two out of three versus a Southern Valley opponent to win the championship."
