Wrestlers tie for fourth in Durham tourney

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Bill Johnson's Norton Community High School varsity wrestling team tied for fourth in the tough J.R. Durham Invitational Wrestling Tournament held Saturday in the NCHS Stull Gym in Norton.

Hoxie edged Cozad, Neb. for the team championship with a total of 135 points, compared to 134 for the visitors from Nebraska. In third place was Scott City with 104. Norton and Oakley both scored 93 points, followed by Smith Center, 80; Beloit, 67; Silver Lake, 66; McCook, Neb., 54; Thomas More Prep-Hays, 36; Atwood, 20; Leoti, 17; Norton JV, 9.

Norton had four runner-up finishers and three fourth place finishers.

Placing runner-up were sophomore Branson Addington, 106; junior John Risewick, 120; sophomore Alec Hager, 126 and senior Cayleb Campbell, 195.

Finishing fourth in their weight classes were senior Justin Waggoner, 126, Norton JV; junior Cody Ellis, 145 and junior Jared Bohl, 152.

Norton had a 20-16 won-loss record and 10-9 pin ratio.

Wrestling for Norton but not placing were freshman Caysean Campbell, Norton JV, 106; sophomore Ethan Ross, 113; senior R.J. Ellis, 132; sophomore Toby Nickell, Norton JV, 132; sophomore Austin Hager, 138; freshman Kendall Miller, Norton JV, 138; junior Lucas Engel, 170; sophomore Kolton Harting, 182. Norton was open at 160, 220 and 285.

Coach's comments

"For us to tie for fourth in this competitive tournament is a big improvement from earlier in the year," said coach Johnson. "Our wrestlers are young and inexperienced but are wrestling hard and showing signs of improvement. However, they still have a lot of improvement to make.

"Our inexperience shows in close matches when we get out of position, thrown to our back and pinned. We hang on too long instead of giving up a one-point escape and starting over again. Those kinds of things we have to clean up. We'll spend a lot of time in practice to improve on these situations.

"Highlight of the tournament for us was that we had four of our wrestlers in the championship finals and three in the consolation championship. We had several others really close to placing and receiving medals. They just got out of position and were pinned after leading matches.

"The disappointment is that we didn't win a single match in the finals. One of our focuses this week will be talking about finishing tournaments."

The Norton coaches chose Alec Hager as last week's "Wrestler of the Week" for the Blue Jays. Named "Outstanding Wrestler" of the tourna-

Coach Doug Reusink's Norton Community High School varsity boys basketball team began the new year with a 48-22 Mid-Continent League victory over Osborne in the NCHS Stull Gym on Friday night.

Defense was the name of the game for Norton in the first half when the Blue Jays limited the Bulldogs to just one three-point field goal in the first quarter and one free throw in the second period.

Norton led 20-3 after one quarter and 34-4 at intermission.

A 12-10 third period in Norton's favor made the score 46-14.

"I thought we played with a lot of energy and executed well in the first half," said coach Reusink. "Our full court pressure was effective in the first quarter which got us off to a good start.

"In the second half, we got a little sloppy but, overall, I was pleased with how our boys played."

Due to the large margin of victory, a lot of Norton players saw action.

Leading scorers for the Blue Jays were senior power forward Jordan Wahlmeier and junior guard Jacob Brooks, each with 15 points. Wahlmeier hit 6 of 13 two-point tries for 46 percent accuracy and 3 of 7 free throws for 43 percent. Brooks swished 1 of 4 from long range for 25 percent and 6 of 9 from two-point land for 67 percent and was 7 of 13 overall for 54 percent. He did not shoot any free throws.

As a team, Norton hit 2 of 10 from beyond the arc for 20 percent, 19 of 45 two-point attempts for 42 percent and 21 of 55 overall for 38 percent.

Osborne hit 1 of 4 long range shots for 25 percent, 9 of 39 two-point tries for 23 percent and 10 of 43 overall for 23 percent.

From the free throw line, Norton was 4 of 9 for 45 percent and Osborne was 1 of 4 for 25 percent.

Norton pulled down 29 rebounds compared to 22 for Osborne. Leading the way in rebounding was Dillon McConney with 9, followed by Jacob Brooks, 6; Jordan Wahlmeier, 6; Dalton Miller, 4; Carson McKenna, 2; Andrew Ellis, 1; Alec Gilgenbach, 1.

Norton blocked 7 Osborne shots. Brooks, Wahlmeier and McConney each rejected 2 shots and Nickell blocked 1.

The Blue Jays had 9 steals compared to 1 for the Bulldogs. McConney led with 3 thefts, followed by Nickell, 2; Brooks, 2; Zach Hartwell, 1; Carson McKenna, 1.

Norton had 11 assists, led by McConney with 4. He was followed by Hartwell, 3; Nickell, 2; Wahlmeier, 1; Ellis, 1.

The Blue Jays had just 4 turnovers while the Bulldogs lost the ball 11 times.
