The Huskies managed only eight points in the first quarter and trailed by only two with the Warriors tallying 10. Senior Daniel Field scored three for the Huskies as they went into second quarter action trailing

Both teams duplicated their offensive output from the first quarter. The Huskies got four points from senior Tyler

Montgomery and went into the halftime break down only four points to the Warriors, 20-16.


