Blue Jays take down Goodland 73-70 on the road

School boys basketball team won a 73-70 shootout at Goodland on Tuesday evening but the final score was as close as the Cowboys came to the Blue Jays after a 10-all first quarter.

Six Norton players scored in the second quarter as the Blue Jays took a 33-20 halftime lead.

The home team picked up the scoring in the third quarter but Norton had a 24-21 edge to increase the Blue Jays' lead to 57-41. To Goodland's credit, they didn't give up and outscored Norton 29-16 in the final quarter to make it close at the end.

Norton led by 12 points at 66-54 with three minutes left in the game but Goodland narrowed the lead to 70-63 with 35 seconds remaining. Norton's senior guard Tye Nickell hit two free throws and senior power forward Jordan Wahlmeier swished one charity for Norton's final 3 points.

Goodland's Ryan Hillmer hit a three-point shot with 20 seconds left, then added a twopoint basket after Wahlmeier's free throw. Hillmer was fouled while shooting but missed the free throw. Taylen Smith, who led Goodland in scoring with 19 points, hit a two-point basket at the buzzer to cut Norton's final margin of victory down to 3 points.

The Norton victory was good to see after the Blue Jays let a 21-12 halftime lead dissolve into a 49-41 loss to the Cowboys earlier this season in the Topside Tip-Off Tournament in Goodland.

"I'm happy with the win on the road," said Norton head

boys basketball coach Doug Reusink. "We did some good things throughout the game, especially offensively, but we're not doing the things we need to do down the stretch.

"We've played them twice and should know how they play and what to do to stop them and finish strong."

With the win, Norton extended their season record to 7-5.

Eight different players scored for Norton. Leading the way was junior guard Jacob Brooks with 19 points on 1 of 1 from beyond the arc, 5 of 9 two-point attempts for 56 percent and 6 of 10 overall for 60 percent. He also hit 6 of 9 free throws for 67

Wahlmeier added 18 points on 8 of 11 from the field for 73 percent and 2 of 8 free throws for 25 percent.

Also scoring in double figures with 13 points was senior guard Zach Hartwell who was a perfect 3 of 3 from beyond the arc and 1 of 1 from two-point range for a perfect 4 of 4 shots from the field. He kept the record perfect at the free throw line where he connected on 2 of 2 charities.

Senior guard Dillon McConney also shot well, hitting 4 of 5 from the field for 80 percent.

As a team, Norton hit 4 of 5 from long range for 80 percent, 24 of 44 two-point tries for 55 percent and 28 of 49 overall for an outstanding 57 percent.

The Cowboys hit 6 of 14 from

beyond the arc for 43 percent, 21 of 45 two-point attempts for 47 percent and 27 of 59 overall for 46 percent. From the free throw line, Nor-

ton was 13 of 27 for 48 percent and Goodland was 10 of 15 for 67 percent.

Both teams had 27 rebounds.

Norton pulled down 9 offensive and 18 defensive caroms and Goodland grabbed 14 offensive and 13 defensive boards.

Wahlmeier led Norton in rebounds with 9, followed by Brooks, 6; Alec Gilgenbach, 6; Nickell, 2; Hartwell, McConney, Andrew Ellis, Dalton Miller, 1 each.

The Norton Blue Jays blocked a season-high 8 Goodland shots. Wahlmeier rejected 5, followed by Brooks, McConney, Gilgenbach, 1 each.

Norton had 8 steals compared to 6 for the Cowboys. Wahlmeier led with 3 thefts, followed by Brooks, 2; Nickell, Hartwell, McConney, 1 each.

Norton recorded 19 offensive assists and Goodland had 13. Nickell and Wahlmeier were assists leaders for Norton with 4 each, followed by Brooks, 3; Hartwell, McConney, Ellis, Miller, 2 each.

The Blue Jays had 19 turnovers and the Cowboys lost the ball 13 times.

The Norton defense also limited Goodland to 23 percent shooting from the field.

It was the second meeting or the year for the two teams. The Lady Jays also defeated the Cowgirls 56-42 in the annual Topside Tip-Off Tournament in Goodland in December.

Norton led the entire game, building quarter leads of 12-8, 20-13 and 31-19.

"This is a tough place for us to play but we did some good things on offense and played good solid defense all night long," said Norton head girls basketball coach Kevin Jilka.

"We gave up too many offensive rebounds the first half but did better in the second half.

"This was a good win after a tough loss on Friday to Trego. We came back and did what we had to do to win.

"We're now even for the sea-

son at 6-6 and that's good." Senior post Erin Terrell was a steady scorer throughout the game for the Lady Jays. She hit two baskets in the first and third quarter, a single basket in the second period and finished with two baskets and two free throws in the final stanza. She hit 7 of 15 attempts for 47 percent accuracy and 2 of 4 from the free throw line for 50 percent and 16

Sophomore guard Katelyn Engelbert hit 8 points on 1 of 1 from long range, 1 of 4 twopoint tries and 2 of 5 overall for 40 percent. She also swished 3 of 4 free throws for 75 percent.

Senior post Caren Thomson was a perfect 3 of 3 from the field for 100 percent and 1 of 2 from the charity stripe for 50 percent and 7 points.

Also scoring 7 points with the same percentages was sophomore post Bailey Ambrosier.


