Lady Jays fall to Smith Center in disappointing loss

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The Norton Community High School varsity girls basketball team had a bad night on Tuesday and it led to a 64-14 loss to Smith Center in Mid-Continent League play in the NCHS Stull

Not only did the Lady Jays not play well but the Lady Redmen played very well, living up

to their No.3 state ranking. The visitors held quarter leads

of 23-1, 35-3 and 53-11. The cold shooting Norton quintet hit only one field goal in

the first half. Smith Center completely dominated in the game, running a defensive press and fast break-

ing on offense. "There was not one thing that we did right," said Norton head girls basketball coach Kevin Jilka. "We didn't handle their press; we had 15 turnovers in the first quarter. We thought we could do some things but they took us out of everything we wanted to do. They got the early lead and it snowballed.

"They're such good athletes and play the way you're supposed to play. They're not No.3 in the state for nothing.

"The best thing for us to do

is have short memories and get ready to play Hill City this Friday. We knew we would have to play a perfect game against Smith Center. We can play better and, hopefully, we learned something and will move on and play much better against the Lady Ringnecks."

Erin Terrell was leading scorer for Norton with 5 points, followed by Bailey Ambrosier, 3; Kamilla Jones, 3; Tawni Griffey, 2; Caren Thomson, 1.

Tangie Hileman led the Lady Redmen with 24 points; Sydney Benoit and McKenzie Benoit each scored 10 points.

Norton hit 1 of 4 from beyond the arc for 25 percent, 4 of 18 two-point shots for 22 percent and 5 of 22 overall for 23 percent. Smith Center scored on 2 of 10 from long range for 20 percent, 28 of 59 two-point tries for 47 percent and 30 of 69 overall for 43 percent.

From the free throw line, Norton hit 3 of 9 for 33 percent and Smith Center connected on 2 of 6 for 33 percent.

The Lady Jays grabbed 4 offensive and 12 defensive rebounds for 16 total and the Lady Redmen pulled down 14 offensive and 10 defensive caroms

Griffey and Terrell led Norton in rebounds with 5 each, followed by Katelyn Engelbert, 3; Ambrosier, Teslee Nickell, Thomson, 1 each.

Norton had 3 steals and Smith Center had 21 thefts. Thomson had 2 steals and Griffey had 1.

The Lady Jays had a seasonhigh 32 turnovers while the Lady Redmen lost the ball just 6 times.

Norton had 3 offensive assists and Smith Center was credited with 16 assists.

Griffey had 2 assists and Engelbert had 1.

Junior varsity

The Norton girls junior varsity lost to Smith Center by a score of 64-29.

Norton trailed by quarters 14-5, 27-16 and 44-27.

Leading scorers for Norton were Marisa Maddy and Alec Melvin with 8 points each, followed by Johnnye Ruder, 7; Katie Bohl, Bailey Ambrosier, Darcy Bainter, 2 each.

Kaitlin Albert and Colbie Decker each scored 16 points for the Lady Redmen.

"When playing against a team like Smith Center, you cannot play in slow motion," said Norton assistant girls basketball coach George Rossi.

"Learning how to play hard is something that we must do and do quickly. We can play with intensity for a bit but then we just let the other team do what they want. That is not Lady Jay basketball!"


