Blue Jays outscore Smith Center in home hoops

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Coach Doug Reusink's Norton Community High School boys varsity basketball team continued their winning streak on Tuesday evening in the NCHS Stull Gym when they outscored the visiting Smith Center quintet 74-66.

The Blue Jays limited their fouls, found the range from three-point land and hit more free throws than the visitors.

Senior power forward Jordan Wahlmeier and junior guard Jacob Brooks are normally the highest scorers for Norton but senior guard Zach Hartwell joined them on Tuesday night. Hartwell chose to shoot only from beyond the arc and, to the delight of the Norton crowd, was very successful. Hartwell hit 5 of 9 long range shots for 56 percent accuracy, missed his only two-point try and ended 5 of 10 overall for 50 percent. From the free throw line, he was a perfect 4 of 4 and ended with 19 points.

Brooks also had a good shooting night to lead all Norton scorers with 22 points. He hit 4 of 6 from beyond the arc for 67 percent, 3 of 9 two-point tries for 33 percent and 7 of 15 overall for 47 percent. He was 4 of 8 from the charity stripe for 50 percent.

Wahlmeier used his normal moves around the basket that frustrate the opponents to tally 15 points. He hit 7 of 17 twopoint shots for 41 percent and was 1 of 6 from the free throw line for 17 percent.

Alex Hobelmann led Smith Center with 18 points; Kale Terrill added 16 and Payton Buckmaster hit 10.

Hartwell got the Norton crowd in the game right from the start when he buried a three-point basket. A Brooks free throw, basket by Wahlmeier, trey by Brooks and two-point basket by senior guard Dillon McConney put Norton on top 11-2.

McConney hit another basket, Wahlmeier added a free

throw, senior guard Tye Nickell swished a basket and Brooks hit a tip-in at the buzzer to end the first quarter with Norton leading 18-12.

Wahlmeier led the way in the second quarter when he hit three more baskets. Hartwell and Nickell each hit nothing but net from three-point range and Brooks hit a two-point basket and free throw as both teams scored 15 points and Norton maintained the six-point lead at 33-27.

The Redmen hit only one shot from beyond the arc in the first half but after intermission they unsuccessfully tried to keep up with the long range bombs put up by the Blue Jays. Norton hit 24 points in the third quarter with 18 of their points coming from beyond the arc! Hartwell and Brooks each buried three long range baskets and Wahlmeier added two baskets.

Norton continued to shoot well in the fourth quarter but focused on two-points and, with the Redmen fouling, went to the free throw line 16 times, hitting 9 of the charities.

Brooks and McConney each hit a basket and two free throws, Hartwell hit his four free throws, Nickell connected on a basket and one charity and Wahlmeier hit one basket.

Smith Center outscored Norton 18-17 in the fourth quarter but it was too little, too late for the Redmen.

"Both teams shot the ball well tonight," said coach Reusink. "We did a nice job offensively and made shots.

"The negative is that we didn't make defensive stops down the stretch but they have some good offensive players.

"We were patient on offense late in the game and were able to get the right guys on the free throw line. And, we did okay hitting our free throws at the end.

"We played the entire game without losing our intensity, which had been a problem the last several games. We stayed

pretty focused and sharp.

"We've now won 8 of our last 10 games with our only losses coming to Plainville."

The win over Smith Center extended Norton's season record so far to 9-5.

As a team, Norton hit 10 of 20 three-point shots for 50 percent, 16 of 35 two-point shots for 46 percent and 26 of 55 overall for 47 percent.

Smith Center connected on 5 of 9 from beyond the arc for 56 percent, 22 of 38 two-point tries for 58 percent and 27 of 47 overall for 57 percent.

Norton hit more free throws than Smith Center. The Blue Jays swished 12 of 25 charities for 48 percent and the Redmen cashed in 7 of 10 for 70 percent.

Norton outrebounded Smith Center 27-19. The Blue Jays grabbed 13 offensive and 14 defensive caroms compared to 4 offensive and 15 defensive for the visitors.

Wahlmeier had another double-double as he pulled down 12 rebounds, followed by Brooks, 7; McConney, 4; Joe LeClair, 2; Hartwell, Alec Gilgenbach, 1 each.

Wahlmeier blocked 2 shots and McConney rejected 1.

Both teams had 11 offensive assists. Nickell led with 4, followed by Hartwell, Wahlmeier, 2 each; Brooks, McConney, Dalton Miller, 1 each.

Norton had just 1 turnover in the game compared to 12 for the Redmen.
