The weekly deli menus include main dishes, vegetables, a variety of salads and desserts and are a delight to their many customers. A special feature of the store that many use, especially the elderly, is home deliveries. Ron and Natalie meet many wonderful people through this service. Hoping the economy is at its lowest ebb, Ron and Natalie feel fortunate that business stays good. They notice that people shop more carefully, watching the ads, buying the sales, and using coupons frequently to help save money. For them, the whole experience of moving to Norton and buying the store has been wonderful. Natalie quipped that coming from a city such as Phoenix, "The community's acceptance and friendliness were almost overwhelming." They feel Norton's future is extremely bright because it has so many things going for it, thanks to Economic Development, the Community Foundation, Chamber of Commerce, and its many wonderful volunteers.
