

Schrum named as Blue Jay Booster of the Year

Steve Schrum has been named the 20th recipient of the prestigious "Blue Jay Booster of the Year" award, presented annually by the Norton Blue Jay Booster Club.

Steve received the plaque for the honor at half-time of the Norton-Atwood boys basketball game last Friday in the NCHS Stull Gym in Norton. He received a loud round of applause as the award was presented to him on behalf of the Blue Jay Booster Club by Norton Activities Director Jeff Wallingford.

This award is given annually to a person in our community who supports Norton Community High School programs and activities in a positive way.

"Congratulations to this year's recipient of the Booster of the Year award," said Norton basketball announcer Larry Black over the public address system.

"Steve was employed by Norton USD 211 for 34 years, retiring in 2002. He has always been a respected icon for the sports programs of Norton. Through his teaching years, Steve coached the following teams for Norton Schools: junior high football, girls basketball and boys track and elementary football, girls and boys basketball, girls and boys track. And, he was even an assistant grade school wrestling coach for four years under coach Jake Durham in the mid-70s.

Steve was also a Norton Blue Jay athlete, com-

peting in football, basketball, track and baseball. "Retiring from the Norton School System did not stop his love of sports and his commitment to the Youth Sports in Norton.

"Before he retired from the school district, he joined the Norton Recreation Commission as, what else but the Activity Director and he is still in this position today. He is still involved in many youth sports camps and programs in Norton. This includes baseball, softball, basketball, youth football, soccer, track and I am sure others. One of Steve's many contributions includes the supervision and work on the renovation of the Blue Jay Field, often referred to as 'Schrum Field.'

"Steve is often seen stopping by and/or watching many of the sports events when Blue Jays are participating. 'Schrumie', as many of us fondly call him, continues to touch the lives of many past, former and even future NCHS Blue Jays!

"Congratulations Steve Schrum!!"

The annual award by the Blue Jay Booster Club is made possible by a memorial in honor of the late Tommy Davison, who was considered to be the ultimate Norton Blue Jay sports booster.

The award is based upon nominations by the booster club members of persons who have gone above and beyond as a fan of Norton sports.


how do we come up with a good estimate? I think we are putting the cart before the horse on the estimated and actual costs."

Ensz asserted, however, that now is the perfect time to think about bonding and funding because the city needs to decide what kind of costs will be built into the bond. Decisions to be made include

whether or not the bond will include only construction costs or other costs like engineering and maintenance.

Though no decisions were made on the matter Wednesday evening, the council agreed to discuss a possible agreement with Cooper, Malone, McLaine, Inc. at the city's finance committee meeting coming up on Monday.
