

Dig to be held in Shawnee County

Volunteers will have an opportunity to participate in the 2012 Kansas Archeology Training Program field school June 2-17. The Kansas State Historical Society and Kansas Anthropological Association will join forces to investigate the Kansas site of Fool Chief's Village (14SH305) on the north side of Topeka in Shawnee County.

This Kansas site was selected because of a road project at the intersection of U.S. 24 and Menoken Road, which will have a negative impact on the site.

The Kansas Historical Society, under contract with the Kansas Department of Transportation and under the direction of the Federal Highway Administration will carry out a data recovery project to mitigate adverse effects to the site.

The annual field school is an opportunity for the public to work along side professional and avoca-

tional archeologists. No experience is necessary, just a desire to learn. Participation can be for all or part of the project. Participants assist archeologists in surveying for sites, excavating sites and cleaning/cataloging artifacts in the lab. Archeology techniques courses are also offered and can be taken for college credit.

Registration fee for the field school is \$20 for members of the Kansas Anthropological Association or Kansas Historical Foundation. Non-member fee is \$80. Children must be at least 10 years old and accompanied by a parent or responsible adult. After May 1 the participation fee increases to \$30 for members and \$90 for non-members.
