



Coroner reports that infant death was SIDS-related

After receiving autopsy results on the matter, a local doctor has reported that the death of a Norton County infant last week was the result of natural causes.

Dr. Glenda Maurer of the Norton County Hospital reported Monday that Gage Waugh, about four months old, passed away last Tuesday at his home south of Norton. Maurer explained that Dr. Lyle Noordhoek, District Coroner from Hays, performed an autopsy on Wednesday and determined that the cause of the infant's death was related to Sudden Infant Death Syndrome and the investigation into the death is now complete.

Norton County emergency personnel were called to a home south of Norton just after 1 p.m. last Tuesday after a report of an infant that had passed away. Though initially expected to take 30 days or more, an autopsy was performed the next day.
