The Norton Community High School junior varsity girls and boys track and field members set 14 different personal records during their final competition of the season in the Hill City Freshman/Sophomore Track Meet on Monday.

As a team, the Norton girls placed sixth with 45 points and the Blue Jay boys finished fifth with 55.5 points.

"Again, this was a very good outing for our junior varsity team," said Norton head track and field coach Jason Jones. "We again posted some personal records on both sides and we had some people step into some spots and really do some good. They are beginning to see the benefits and payoff from their hard work and that is fun to see.

"Most of these girls and boys will be off for a couple of weeks but we will pull a few of them here and there and give them a look at some varsity competition over the next couple of weeks. Ideally, some of them will put themselves in positions to attend the League meet for us and help us out there, as well.

Sophomore Cristine Nelson was one of two gold medal winners for the Lady Jays. She set a personal record of 30'10" in heaving the shot to place first. She also finished third in the discus with a throw of 82'8".

The other Norton gold medal winner was freshman Kenzie Esslinger, who cleared 7'9" in the pole vault.

Sophomore Rickele Green scored 16 points by placing in three events. She finished runner-up in the javelin with a throw of 78'7", fourth in the shot put with a heave of 28'6.5" and fourth in the discus with a throw of 78'7".

Norton junior Stephanie Hager placed sixth in the 300 meter hurdles in 1:08.37 and sixth in the 1600 meter run in 7:53.54.

Lady Jay freshman Sheridan Dillehay finished sixth in the 200 meter dash in a personal best time of 33.21.

Dillehay and Esslinger tied for tenth in the 100 meter dash with personal records of 15.26.

Norton freshman Stewart Whitney placed in four different events. He was runner-up in the shot put with a personal record distance of 38'1.75", fifth in the discus with a personal best toss of 93'5" and sixth in the 100 meter dash in 12.43.

In addition, Whitney anchored the 4 x 100 meter relay team of freshmen Christian Boser, Derick Campbell and Kobie Unterseher to a third place finish in 49.65.

Boser set a personal record of 2:20.31 with a third place finish in the 800 meter run.

Freshmen Norton twins Dalton and Clay Vanover both placed in the 1600 meter run. Dalton finished third in 5:50.78 and Clay finished fifth in a personal record time of 6:10.08.


