Norton track teams perform well at Oberlin meet

Oberlin won the girls championship with 144 points, followed by Norton, 97; Smith Center, 77; Atwood, 61; Dighton, 56; Oakley, 49; Wheatland, 32; Phillipsburg, 28; St. Francis, 12.

The boys champion was Smith Center with 97 points, followed by Oberlin, 81; Oakley, 68.66; Wheatland, 68; Hoxie, 68; Norton, 61; St. Francis, 56; Phillipsburg, 34; Atwood, 14.33; Dighton, 10.

"This meet went well for us," said Norton Community High School head track and field coach Jason Jones. "We were missing some athletes due to other commitments and we were coming off a meet on Monday but both teams put up very solid performances.

"We are continuing to get better in a number of areas and that is our goal at this point in the season. Our athletes posted new personal records and we still hope to build on those performances and gain some more confidence in some areas as we prepare to enter the league meet next Friday. We are looking forward to getting our whole team back together again for the upcoming meets!"
