This exhibition has been made possible through NEH on the Road, a special initiative of the National Endowment for the Humanities. It is brought to you by Mid-American Arts Alliance and organized by the Museum for African Art in New York City.

The exhibit tells the story of the Lowcountry coiled basket, one of the oldest African-inspired arts in America. Today, basket makers concentrated near Mt. Pleasant, S.C., sew baskets out of sweetgrass, bulrush, palmetto, and pine needles, selling them from roadside stands that line the highway into Charleston, S.C., and at tourist destinations in the city. The finest of their creations are acquired by museums and collectors; the work of the most famous Lowcountry basket maker,
