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Norton teams take first, second place in MCL Track

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The Norton Community High School girls and boys varsity track and field teams had by far their best outing of the season on Friday when the Lady Jays won the Mid-Continent League championship and the Blue Jay boys finished runner-up in the annual competition at Wa-Keeney.

The Lady Jays compiled a total of 110.5 points while runnerup Smith Center scored 92 to edge Trego, who scored 91, for third. Phillipsburg was fourth with 68 points, followed by Hill City, 53.5; Osborne, 51; Stockton, 34; Plainville, 33; Ellis, 25.

The Norton boys scored 87 points but Plainville, led by senior distance ace Brady Johnson, tallied 113.5. Johnson earned three gold medals and anchored a Cardinal relay team to earn another.

Smith Center and Phillipsburg tied for third with 79 points each and Osborne was right behind in fifth with 77.5. The Bulldogs were followed by Hill City with 60, Stockton with 24, Ellis with 20 and Trego with 15.

"What a great effort our girls and boys put forward!" said Norton head track and field coach Jason Jones. "We got off the bus and competed hard and the results speak for themselves. We are extremely proud of their efforts and performances!

"Today, we had some individuals really step up and compete with resolve. That is a great trait to see as we enter regionals and state in the next two weeks.

"Our girls won their first league championship since, I believe, the 2006 season and our boys did well placing second to an outstanding Plainville team.

"We set eight new personal records and that is what we look for at this point in the season. We will work to continue to improve our marks as we head into regionals and state.

"We could not be more proud of our athletes and the manner in which they prepared, competed and conducted themselves. It is always fun to see them have the success that they have worked so hard to capture. We are excited about the next couple of weeks!"

Engelbert placed runner-up in the 800 meter run in 2:39.12.

Junior Alec Melvin placed runner-up behind Nickell in the shot put with a heave of 36'7.25". Melvin also scored points in the discus, where she had a third place throw of 107'11" and in the javelin with a third place finish with a throw of 115'2".

Norton freshman Sierra Griffith was a steady runner in the distance races. She set a personal record of 5:57.73 in placing runner-up in the 1600 meter run and was timed in 13:03.30 in the 3200 meter run, where she also placed runner-up.

He was runner-up in the 200 meter dash in 22.57 and fourth in the 100 meter dash in 11.40. In addition, Brooks anchored the 4 x 100 meter relay team to a fourth place finish in 46.97. Running with him were Henry, senior Trey Millan and sophomore Austin Hager, who also placed third in the pole vault with a height of 12'.

Senior distance ace Zach Hartwell also had a good day. He placed runner-up to Plainville's Johnson in both the 1600 meter and 3200 meter runs. Hartwell was timed in 4:59.40 in the 1600 meter run where Johnson won in 4:58.12 and in 10:50.06 in the 3200 where Johnson was timed in 10:48.11.

Hartwell was also a member of the Blue Jays' 4 x 800 meter relay team which finished third in 8:49.79. Running with him in the relay were Henry and sophomores Marc Miller and Drew Schrum.

Miller placed third in the 800 meter run with a time of 2:08.87. He was edged out by Johnson, who was timed in 2:07.28 and Kenton Ubelaker of Osborne who had a time of 2:07.68.

Miller also teamed with Henry, senior Dillon McConney and junior Carson McKenna in placing fifth in the 4 x 400 meter relay in 3:47.06.

Sophomore Alec Hager placed fifth in the 1600 meter run with a personal best time of 5:14.55 and sixth in the 800 meter run in 2:22.30.

Two Norton freshmen had sixth place finishes. Dalton Vanover placed sixth in the 3200 meter run in 11:40.62 and Derick Campbell finished sixth in the triple jump with a distance of 33'1".
