Tickets on sale for rodeo

Tickets go on sale July 2 for Kansas' Biggest Rodeo in Phillipsburg at Heritage Insurance Company.

The rodeo is August 2-4 and is run by a committee of volunteers.

It brings together the people of Phillipsburg, who are known for their volunteerism, according to Mayor Fred Robinson. "Anytime there's a need, the community steps right up to see that it gets done. The rodeo has created a willingness to volunteer among the community so that people step up when there's a need." Community people give of their time to put the rodeo on. The rodeo "is all done by volunteers, the ticket takers, the concessions, everything."

This year's rodeo's entertainment includes barrelman and rodeo clown Slim Garner and specialty act, the Ranch Riata Cowboy Girls, who will trick rope and trick ride. Beutler and Son Rodeo Co. will return with their string of bucking horses and bulls, and Randy Corley will call the action. The Chain Ranch longhorn herd will be part of the parade through downtown Phillipsburg on August 4.

Robinson, who has attended the rodeo consistently since

1960, speaks highly of the town's rodeo. "We have one of the nicest arenas of anywhere I've been around. The stock contractor we have is, as far as I'm concerned, at the top, and the announcer and specialty act they bring is a first class show. And they work hard to keep it that way."

Prices are \$14 for reserved and \$12 for general admission for adults and \$10 for reserved and \$9 for children.
