The Dane G. Hansen Memorial Museum presents "John Steuart Curry." This exhibit will open July 6 and run through August 26. It will consist of approximately 40 works with an emphasis on the forces of nature.

Born in Dunavant, John Steuart Curry trained at the Chicago Art Institute and the Academie Julian in Paris. Although he taught at the Art Students League and Cooper Union in New York City, N.Y. Curry rejected the impersonal quality of industrialism and instead favored subject matter reflective of his agrarian background.

We are looking forward to the David Vollbracht Oil Painting Workshop on July 11, 12, 13 and 14. David resides in Medicine Lodge and has earned a

degree in art from Fort Hays State University. He is a representational landscape painter of the west. His work reflects the quality of light, nature and spirit drawn from the land. David emphasizes the beauty and importance of the natural landscape in his compositions. 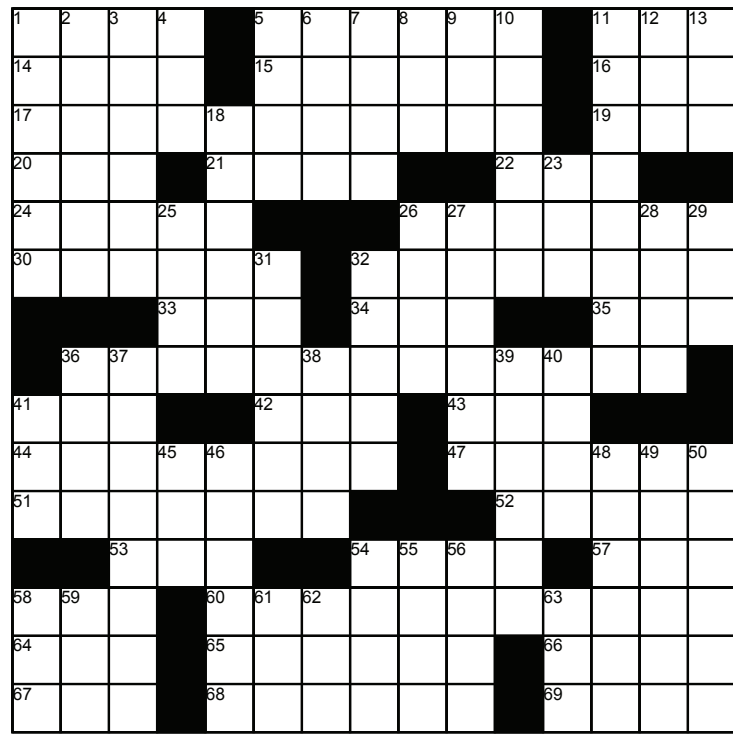
