School registration is approaching quickly

Summer is quickly passing and enrollment for a new school year is coming up for students who will be attending Norton Community Schools this

year will be Aug. 6-9.

Aug. 6 is senior registration from 9 a.m. to noon. Aug. 7 will be junior registration from 9 a.m. to noon. Sophomores will register from 9 a.m to noon on Aug. 8 and freshman registration is Aug. 9 from 9 a.m. to noon.

New high school student registraton is Aug. 10 from 9 a.m. to noon and Aug. 10 will be make-up registration, also from 9 a.m.-noon.

For junior high students, seventh graders will register Aug. 9 from 9 a.m. noon and 1-4 p.m. Students in 8th grade will register on Aug. 8 from 9 a.m.-noon and 1-4 p.m.

Eisenhower Elementary registration will be Aug. 7 from 8 a.m.-4 p.m. in the elementary band room.

Students who are registering for the first time in Norton schools must pro-Enrollment for the 2012-2013 school vide proof of identity, which can in- at 8 a.m. and this is the only morning record, passport and/or immunization

> New students must also provide proof of immunization and a physical. A physical for all incoming kindergarten students is required and for students moving in from out of state that are under the age of 9.

For students who need transportation to and from school, country route information sheets are available in the parent packets online. Parents are asked to complete the information sheet and return it during school registration. Bus routes will be established after registration is complete.

A shuttle for Eisenhower students will be offered from the Unified Office at 105 E. Waverly. The shuttle leaves clude birth certificate, copy of custody shuttle. Afternoon shuttle will stop at order, certified transcript, baptismal the unified office and then drop students downtown at First Avenue and Main Street. Sign-up for the shuttle service will be held on registration day at Eisenhower Elementary. Questions about transportation can be directed to Transportation Director Jim Jackson at 877-6508 or 871-1319.

> Season passes for school activities can be purchased at the district's unified office at 105 E. Waverly. Adult passes are \$45 and student passes are \$45. The passes are good for all home school activities other than activities sponsored by the Kansas State High

School Activity Association. The passes do not provide admittance to league or state tournaments. Activity tickets will be free for junior/senior high school students. Students must present their activity tickets at each school activity they attend and the tickets are not transferable

Book rental can also be paid at registration. Prices are as follows: Early childhood and Kindergarten-\$10, Grades 1 to 6-\$20, Grades 7 and 8-\$25 and Grades 9 to 12-\$30.

The prices for school lunches are as follows for the 2012-2013 year:

> K-3: \$1.90 4-6: \$2 Junior High: \$2.30 High School: \$2.35 K-6 breakfast: \$1.20 7-12 breakfast: \$1.30

The district uses lunch tickets that are issued to Elementary students as permanent, laminated cards. Cards are issued at no cost, but the cost to replace a card is \$2. Parents can purchase meal cards for any amount, but when the balance drops below the cost of two meals, parents will be given a reminder to re-load the card.

School will begin on Friday, Aug. 17. Classes will meet from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. on that day and buses will run. On Friday, Aug. 31, school will dismiss at 2:30 p.m. The regular school schedule is 8:15 a.m.-Students may go to their classrooms, 8:30 a.m.-Classes begin and 3:30 p.m.-All classes are dismissed.

Bird testing set for July 20

Routine surveillance of Avian Influenza as well as monitoring for Pullorum for infectious diseases of poultry will be required for chickens and waterfowl exhibited at the Norton County Fair. Testing of the birds will be done Friday, July 20 from 10:30 a.m. to noon at the livestock barn at the Norton County Fairgrounds.

The Fair Association and state health officials urge all those entering chickens to have the birds tested. Birds over 4 months of age are to be tested. Turkeys, game birds and guineas need not
