#### **NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS UNDER FERPA**

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) affords parents and students over 18 years of age ("eligible students") certain rights with respect to the student's education records. These rights are:

(1) The ri the student's education records within 45 days of the day the School receives a request for access.

Parents or eligible students should submit to the School principal (or appropriate school official) a written request that identifies the record(s) they wish to inspect. The School official will make arrangements for access and notify the parent or eligible student of the time and place where the records may be inspected.

(2) The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the parent or eligible student believes are inaccurate.

Parents or eligible students may ask the School to amend a record that they the School principal (or appropriate of your desire to "opt out".

If the School decides not to amend the record as requested by the parent or eligible student, the School will notify the parent or eligible student of the decision and advise them of their right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the parent or eligible student when notified of the right to a hearing.

(3). The right to consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without

One exception, which permits disclosure without consent, is disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by the School as an administrator, supervisor, instructor, or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel); a person serving on the School Board; a person or company with whom the School has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant, or therapist); or a parent or student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.

ORDINANCE NO. 1623 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 7-304 OF THE NORTON CITY CODE RELATING TO ABOVE-GROUND STORAGE OF FLAMMABLE AND COMBUSTIBLE LIQUIDS IN TANKS AND COMPRESSED GAS NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF NORTON, KANSAS:

Section 1: Sections 7-304 of the Code of the City of Norton is hereby amended

7-304 ABOVE-GROUND STORAGE OF FLAMMABLE AND COMBUSTIBLE LIQUIDS IN TANKS AND COMPRESSED GAS. That the above-ground storage of flammable and combustible liquids and compressed gas in outside above-ground tanks shall be prohibited within the City of Norton, except as further allowed herein. That the restrictions and limitations referred to in the International Fire Code, as hereby adopted, as to above-ground storage of flammable and combustible liquids in tanks and as to compressed gases shall be adhered to. That the above ground storage of flammable and combustible liquids shall be allowed as to all storage on City owned property; all storage between Washington Street and Pearl Street from South Second Avenue to South Graves Avenue; all storage in containers not exceeding 1,000 gallons in capacity in the Light Industrial District when installed in full compliance with the State Fire Marshal's Regulations, and not within 50 feet of a highway; all storage on Lots 8, 9 & 12 of Block 2, Brigg's Addition to the City of Norton; all storage on an irregular tract described as beginning 2576.03 feet North of the Southeast corner of the Southeast Quarter, thence West 585.45 Feet, Thence North 560 Feet, thence East 595.45 Feet, Thence South 562 feet, all in Section 27, Township 2 South, Range 23 West of the Sixth P.M., Norton County, Kansas; and all storage beginning 3172 Feet North and 107.1 Feet West of the Southeast Corner of 27-2-23, thence North 395 Feet, thence East 499 feet, thence southwesterly 395 Feet to the place of beginning, less the road right of way all in Section 27, Township 2 South, Range 23 West of the 6th P.M., Norton County, Kansas; and all storage as to Lot 2, Block 1, Cases's addition to the City of Norton, Kansas and all that portion of West Norton Street, reverting thereto by vacating Ordinance 326 of the City of Norton, Kansas; and all of Block 4 and Lots 1,2, 9, 10, 11 and 12 in Block Five, all in Golf Addition to the City of Norton, Norton County, Kansas


