# Legion team ends season with tourney loss

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The Norton American Legion baseball team's 2012 season ended sooner than expected with two losses in the AA Zone Tournament in Goodland.

On Sunday evening, Norton lost 8-6 to Goodland and, on Monday evening, the Blue Jays were outscored 10-1 by Ellis in the double elimination tourna-

The winner of the tournament will play next week in the Kansas American Legion Tournament in Sabetha.

#### Goodland

Goodland scored one run in the top of the first inning but Norton took a 3-1 lead in the bottom of the inning. Trey Millan got on base on an error, Dakota Dreher and Tug Keiswetter both doubled and Andrew Ellis and Trever Lewis both singled. Milan, Dreher and Keiswetter all scored.

Goodland added four runs in the top of the second to take a 5-3 advantage. Norton narrowed it to 5-4 with a single run in the bottom of the second when Millan blasted a home run! Dreher doubled but died on

Neither team scored in the third inning but Goodland added one run in the top of the fourth to make it 6-4. The Blue Jays did not score in the bottom of the fourth and Goodland added two more runs in the top of the fifth to extend their lead to 8-4.

A single run by Norton in the bottom of the fifth cut the Cowboy lead to 8-5. Dreher walked, Miller singled, Keiswetter got on base on a fielder's choice and Lewis singled. Dreher scored.

Goodland was scoreless the rest of the way but Norton could only come up with one more run in the bottom of the sixth. Lane Bigge and Millan both singled and Dreher walked. Bigge scored to narrow the Cowboy lead to 8-6.

Norton got three runners on base in the bottom of the seventh but was unable to cross home plate and Goodland won 8-6 and advanced in the winner's bracket.

Norton had 10 hits, three walks and seven strike outs. Leading hitters for the Blue Jays were Dakota Dreher, 2 for 2; Trey Millan, 2 for 4; and Trever Lewis, 2 for 4.

Trey Millan was the losing pitcher. He gave up five hits, walked 11 and struck out six batters in four and two-thirds innings. Dalton Miller relieved him and gave up one hit, walked two and struck out three batters in two and one-third stanzas.

### **Coach's comments**

"This loss was a tough one to take," said Norton head coach Scott Ellis. "They returned the same team from last year and we had twice as many hits as them. We had a lot of line drives right at them, too. We just gave up way too many base on balls. Dakota had a great night at the plate and Trever continued to hit the ball hard."

#### **Ellis**

Seven errors were the Blue Jays' downfall in the contest Monday evening with Ellis.

Norton scored their only run in the bottom of the second inning. Travis Cressler walked, Trey Millan singled, Dakota Dreher walked and Cressler scored.

Ellis tallied one run in the top of the second inning, two in the top of the third, two in the top of the fifth, three in the top of the sixth and two in the top of the seventh inning.

Norton had just four hits, nine walks and seven strike outs. Trey Millan, Tug Keiswetter, Andrew Ellis and Trever Lewis each had one hit.

Dalton Miller pitched the first inning, allowed one hit, walked two batters and struck out two. Tug Keiswetter pitched the rest of the way and took the loss. He gave up five hits, walked three and struck out one batter.

### Coach's comments

"We did not play very well against Ellis," said coach Ellis. "Tug pitched well against a very athletic team. He gave up three walks but was hurt by a lot of errors. We continued to hit the ball hard but I lost track of how many Sunday hops and line drives we hit right at them. It was really discouraging for our boys."

Norton compiled a 17-9 record this season. Assisting coach Ellis again this season was assistant coach Shawn Miller.

"Every team in this Zone Tournament was good," said coach Ellis. "The luckiest team will win it.

"We had just as much talent as any team but every other team had more experience than us. We are very young and will lose just four players. Our three starters Tug Keiswetter, Dakota Dreher and Jordan Wahlmeier will be missed. They are super
