

Norton athlete winning medals at Iowa State

A record holder in two events at Norton Community High School, Hayli Bozarth has continued to show steady improvement in track and field in three throwing events at Iowa State University in Ames.

Hayli competed as a freshman in discus, shot put and hammer throw for the Lady Cyclones before redshirting her second year in 2010-2011.

Her sophomore year in eligibility in 2011-2012 was an exceptional one. She threw the shot a personal best distance of 52'4" at the Iowa State Classic. In the Big 12 Indoor Championships, she earned All-Big 12 honors when she placed fifth in the shot put with a distance of 51'1.75".

In the weight throw indoors, she set a personal best in the Bill Bergan Invitational in Ames with a heave of 60'3.25" to place third. In the Big 12 Indoor Championships, she finished 12th with a distance of 54'10".

In the outdoor season, she placed seventh in the shot put in the Big 12 Championships held in Manhattan with a distance of 51'7". In Regionals competition in Austin, Texas, Hayli placed 11th with a personal best heave of 52'9.25". In so doing, she qualified for the NCAA Championships where she finished 24th with no mark.

In the hammer throw this past season, Hayli placed fifth in the Big 12 Championships in Manhattan with a personal best distance of 188'7". This performance qualified her for the NCAA Regionals in Austin, Texas, where she finished 32nd with a throw of 185'6".

In the outdoor discus competition, Hayli was 13th place in the Big 12 Championships in Manhattan with a distance of 144'5".

"The past year for Hayli was a consistent im-

provement on her entire career at Iowa State," said her Lady Cyclone throws coach Grant Wall. "Every year, she is the standard of consistency and this is due to her work ethic every day at practice."

"Her indoor season set the tone for the year and was the catalyst for her qualifying for the NCAA Championships outdoors. Her first time scoring in the shot put in the toughest women's shot put conference in the nation proved to her that she belonged with the best. This performance gave her the confidence to take it to the next level."

"All of this began last summer in her training. What is exciting for the future is that her training this summer has been exceptional. She has taken her success from the year and channeled it into her summer training. I expect her to be a dominant force in the conference, NCAA and to make noise at the U.S. Championships this next summer."

"Consistency was the key for me leading up to my personal best during the indoor season," said Hayli. "I was able to make great improvements in throwing, in the weight room and in overall training."

"I was also extremely happy with my outdoor season. Although I didn't want to end it falling short of the Olympic trials and fouling out of the NCAA National meet, it was a great learning experience and I used that to motivate my summer training."

"In my junior year of eligibility, I hope to improve my personal bests in each event and qualify for both indoor and outdoor Nationals and also the USA Championships."

"We have a great bond on our team and hold each other accountable."

Hayli was a state track medalist all four years in high school for the Lady Blue Jays. Her senior

year, she won the gold medal in both the shot and discus and placed fifth in the javelin, just a few inches out of third.

Haley is the Norton Community High School record holder in the shot and discus. She broke the shot put record with a heave of 45'5.5" in the league meet in Plainville her senior season and

the discus record with a throw of 143'4" in the Russell Relays in 2008.

She is also a former all-Mid-Continent League performer in both volleyball and basketball.

Hayli is the daughter of Marla and Curt Bozarth. Her grandparents are Bozie and the late Deloros Bozarth and the late Rose and Leo Uhrich.

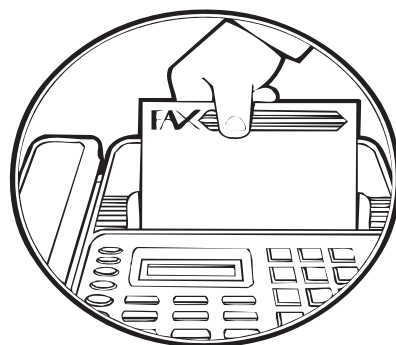
