The Michael E. DeBakey Heart Institute of Kansas will sponsor the A Valvular Heart Disease Symposium on Friday, Sept. 14 at HaysMed, Hadley Conference Rooms, 2220 Canterbury, Hays. Registration begins at 8 a.m. and the program runs from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Topics to be addressed include common aortic valve clinician problems, surgical treatment of aortic valve disease, catheter based therapy for valvular disease, interventional treatment

modalities for atrial fibrillation, mitral regurgitation, surgical treatment options in mitral valve disease and updates in cardiology and cardiac surgery.

This program is designed for Physicians, PAs, ARNPs, Registered Nurses, Licensed Practical Nurses, Respiratory Therapists, Social Workers, PTs, OTs and other interested healthcare professionals. Hours of continuing education credit are available for CNE, CME and Respiratory Therapy credit. Approval

is pending for ASRT Category A credit.
