

Junior Huskies lose on the road

The Northern Valley Junior Huskies football team traveled to Logan on Thursday, Sept. 6 to take on the Logan/Damar Trojans at Trojan Field.

The third quarter was the difference in the game as the Trojans scored 16 unanswered points en route to a 40-20 win over the the Huskies.

Despite the loss, the Huskies had an outstanding performance from eighth-grader Carson Wallace, who led his team in rushing with 19 carries for 142 yards, one touchdown and a 2-point conversion; in receiving with three catches for 77 yards; and on defense he led the team with 13 tackles, five assists and one interception.

First quarter, the Trojans got on the board first with eighth-grader Riley Nyp's 50 yard jaunt to the end zone. Fellow eighth-grader Josh VanLaeys capped off the drive with a successful run for the 2-point conversion, 8-0 Trojans. The Huskies responded with a long run of their own. Carson Wallace got loose for a 40 yard touchdown run. He would run it in for the conversion as well, and the game was tied at 8-8.

Logan/Damar answered back with another long run from Nyp. He would go 35 yards on the touchdown run and VanLaeys ran it in for the conversion, 16-8 Trojans.

The Huskies kept pace with seventh grader Caden Kinderknecht capping a scoring drive with a 4-yard touchdown run. The Huskies failed on the 2-point conversion and would go into halftime trailing 16-14.

In the second half the Huskies defense couldn't stop the Trojans' VanLaeys. Third quarter, VanLaeys would go in for the score from 24 yards out and Nyp would run it in for the conversion, and Logan/Damar extended its lead to 24-14. Then VanLaeys broke free on a 43 yard touchdown run and scored the 2-point conversion, giving the Trojans a 32-14 lead.

In the fourth, Wallace would give the Huskies hope for a comeback with a 65 yard kick-off return and touchdown. The conversion was no good, but the Huskies cut into the Trojans lead, 32-20.

But Van Laeys would dash the Huskies hopes with a 12 yard touchdown run and 2-point conversion, sealing the Trojans' 40-20 victory over the Huskies.

After the game Huskies head coach Jim Cole summed up his team's effort.

"We improved as a team from week one. We blocked better on offense and our backs ran harder. Our defensive ends did a

lot better job of containing and tackling on defense," Cole said. "We let Logan/Damar have too many long runs for touchdowns. The Huskies will keep working hard in practice and try to get better every week."

Land placed 20th. Brooke Baird placed first in the women's junior varsity race and Allison Keith also medaled with an eighth place finish.

Huskies cross country coach Kirk Kasson had nothing but praise for his team after the meet.

"I was pleased with our first outing. It was a hot day and we suffered a little from

that. Four of our six runners medaled. We have four freshmen who ran their first race, so I'm glad they have a good experience to build upon," said Kasson.

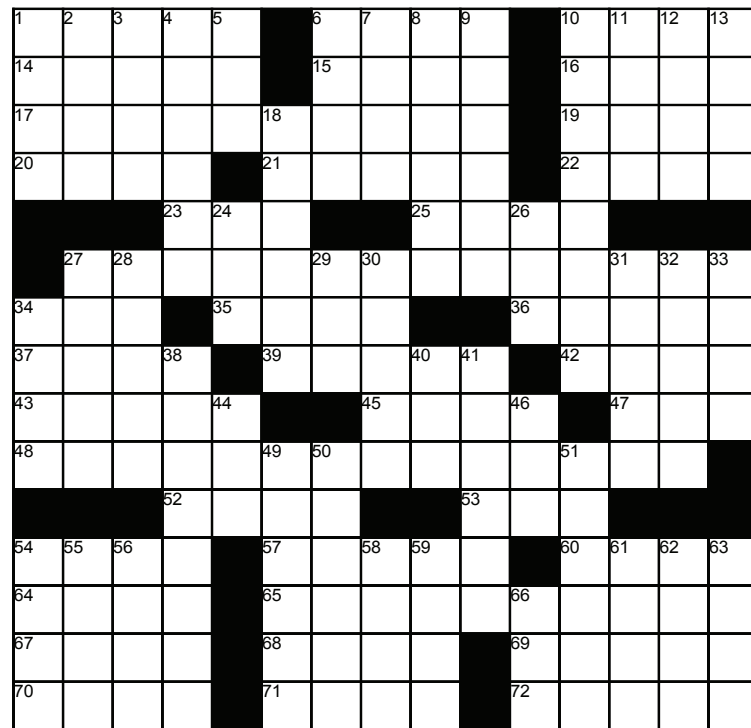
