

Huskies are undefeated after victory over Palco

The Northern Valley Huskies celebrated the 25th anniversary of their 1986-87 State Championship football teams on Friday, Sept. 14 with a crushing 56-6

victory over the Palco Roosters at Husky Field. It was the Huskies rushing attack, once again, that proved to be the difference in the ball game. The Huskies racked up 415 yards on the ground while

allowing Palco only 138 total yards. In the first quarter, sophomore running back Phillip Bryant got the party started with a 10 yard touchdown run and Bryant scored on the 2-point conversion, 8-0 Huskies. Late in the first quarter, junior quarterback Hunter Chandler punched it in from the 2 yard line and scored the 2-point conversion, 16-0 Huskies.

In the second quarter, Northern Valley scored four touchdowns. First, it was Chandler with a 15 yard run for the score, 22-0 Huskies. Then junior running back Jordan Baird muscled his way into the end zone from five yards out. Chandler passed to senior Jon Compton for the conversion and the Huskies led 30-0. Baird got loose again for a 23 yard touchdown run and

it was 36-0, Huskies. Late in the second quarter, the Huskies didn't let up. With Palco punting deep in its own territory the Huskies put the rush on and blocked the punt and it was recovered by Chandler in the end zone for another score, and the rout was on as the Huskies took a 42-0 lead into halftime. In the third quarter, the Roosters avoided the shutout with a 55 yard touchdown pass from Brent Gehring to Kolt Newell, 42-6 Huskies.

But the Huskies had their minds set on ending this game early. Bryant scored on a five yard carry and run for the conversion, 50-6 Huskies. Sophomore quarterback Matt Stutsman got in on the action with a six yard touchdown run of his own which ended the game at 6:37 remaining in the

third quarter with the 45 point rule in effect. Huskies won easily, 56-6, over the Palco Roosters. For the second week in a row, head coach Chuck Fessenden's ground assault amassed over 400 yards rushing. The Huskies leading rusher was Chandler with 14 rushes for 154 yards and two touchdowns. Baird had 12 carries for 106 yards and two touchdowns and Phillip Bryant rushed 14 times for 95 yards and two touchdowns.

"Our line is continuing to improve. We came off the ball a lot harder and lower than we had in the first two weeks. All of our backs ran hard," said coach Fessenden.

With the exception of two long passes, the Huskies had another solid defensive effort. Bryant led the team with 10

tackles, Stutsman and junior Ian Vincent had eight tackles each. Chandler pitched in with seven tackles and seniors Terry Shradler and Tyson Callaway had six tackles apiece.

"On defense we did a solid job against the run and put some good pressure on the quarterback. We did give up a 43 yard pass in the first half and (in the third quarter) after we had substituted we let Palco get a 55-yarder for a touchdown," said Fessenden.

"This was a nice win for us in front of a big crowd that was here to celebrate the State Championships of 1986 and 87."

Northern Valley will be back in action this evening when they take on the Logan Trojans at Trojan Field.

The Lady Huskies' high scorer was Sarah Baird with 22 points followed by VanPatten with 15 points.

The junior varsity was also in action winning its best two out of three matches, 15-13, 9-15 and 15-8. Freshman Allison Keith did well passing the ball and the top scorer was again Sarah Baird with seven points.
