Baird got loose again for a 23 yard touchdown run and

it was 36-0, Huskies. Late in the second quarter, the Huskies didn't let up. With Palco punting deep in its own territory the Huskies put the rush on and blocked the punt and it was recovered by Chandler in the end zone for another score, and the rout was on as the Huskies took a 42-0 lead into halftime.

In the third quarter, the Roosters avoided the shutout with a 55 yard touchdown pass from Brent Gehring to Kolt Newell, 42-6 Huskies.

But the Huskies had their minds set on ending this game early. Bryant scored on a five yard carry and run for the conversion, 50-6 Huskies.

Sophomore quarterback Matt Stutsman got in on the action with a six yard touchdown run of his own which ended the game at 6:37 remaining in the

For the second week in a row, head coach Chuck Fessenden's ground assault amassed over 400 yards rushing. The Huskies leading rusher was Chandler with 14 rushes for 154 yards and two touchdowns, Baird had 12 carries for 106 yards and two touchdowns and Phillip Bryant rushed 14 times for 95 yards and two touchdowns.

"Our line is continuing to improve. We came off the ball a lot harder and lower than we had in the first two weeks. All of our backs ran hard," said coach Fes-


