Blue Jays earn decisive victory over Oberlin

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The Norton Community High School football team took advantage of Oberlin fumbles to defeat the Red Devils, 35-2, on Friday night in Oberlin.

"Our offense wasn't very crisp and we made poor offensive choices," said Norton Head Coach Lucas Melvin. "Defensively, we played very well. We got a lot of turnovers and converted them to scores, so that was good."

The victory extended Norton's season record to 3-1.

First quarter

Defense was the name of the game throughout most of the first quarter. Norton's Austin Hager kicked off to open the contest. After one first down, Oberlin punted to Norton. After a threeand-out by both teams, Oberlin punted to Norton and a block in the back penalty put the ball back on the Blue Jay 15 yard line.

This time, Norton's offense moved down the field fueled by carries by senior tailback Jacob Brooks and senior fullback Jared Bohl mixed with a 10 yard pass to senior wide receiver John Risewick. Norton had the ball on the Red Devil 21 yard line as the scoreless first quarter came to a close.

Second quarter

Norton senior quarterback Dalton Miller sneaked for a first down on the 16, then passed to senior wide receiver Andrew Ellis for a first down on the 6. Bohl bulled to the 3, then Miller scored to put the visitors on top 6-0, which remained when Hager missed the first time this season kicking for the extra point.

After Hager's kickoff, the Norton defense held Oberlin to another three-and-out. Brooks got a good punt return to the Red Devil 30. Helped by a pass interference penalty on Oberlin and good runs by Brooks and Bohl, Norton moved close to another score.

Miller appeared to have scored his second touchdown of the game on a sneak but officials ruled that he was aided by his fellow players and Norton was penalized 5 yards. The next down, Miller passed to Bohl in the end zone. Hager split the uprights this time and the Jays led 13-0.

Hager's kickoff was returned to the Oberlin 38. One first down and a roughing the passer penalty against Norton allowed the Red Devils to move to the Norton 13 yard line. The gang tackling Norton defense put a stop to the drive, allowing no more yards on three plays. Then, on fourth down, the Red Devils completed a pass, Brooks caused a fumble, picked up the ball and sprinted untouched 80 yards to score.

Norton showed a new wrinkle in their offense when receiver Ellis passed to junior tailback Tanner Furbush for two extra points, extending the Norton lead to 21-0.

Hager's kickoff was returned to the Oberlin 35. Once again, the Norton defense was equal to the occasion and forced another three-and-out. This time, however, the Red Devils did not get the punt off as Brooks came charging in to block it. Senior tackle Lucas Engel fell on the ball on the Oberlin 8 yard line.

On second down, Norton found the end zone for

the fourth time in the quarter when Miller passed to sophomore wide receiver Kobie Unterseher and he made a catch in traffic. Hager's kick made it 28-0 in favor of the Blue Jays.

After Hager's kickoff, Oberlin went for broke in the passing game. A long pass by Red Devil junior quarterback Dayton Dreher was caught near the Norton goalline. Brooks caused a fumble, picked up the ball and was driven into the end zone. Officials ruled that a safety had occurred, giving Oberlin two points.

Norton punted to the Red Devils. Once again, the Norton defense was rock solid and the first half ended with Norton leading 28-2.

Third quarter

Norton had the ball twice and Oberlin once in the third quarter before the Red Devils took over at mid-field after a Norton punt and produced their only scoring threat of the game. Mixing running and passing, Oberlin moved downfield to the Norton 1 yard line.

The Blue Jay defense stuffed the first down play for no gain, then forced a fumble on second down. Norton linebacker Bohl came up with the ball on the 2 yard line. After one play, the quarter ended with the Blue Jays dodging a bullet and still leading 28-2.

Fourth quarter

Two Miller passes were knocked down by Oberlin defenders and Jacob Brooks punted to the Norton 38. The Norton defense held again and, after four downs and no yards, the Red Devils gave up the ball.

Norton was held to three-and-out and Brooks punted to the Oberlin 35. Once again, the swarming Blue Jay defenders held and Oberlin went into punt formation. It was a fake but the resulting pass was incomplete and Norton regained possession of the pigskin on the Oberlin 39.

The Red Devils intercepted a Miller pass on their 19 yard line. On second down, they fumbled again and Norton sophomore noseguard Stewart Whitney fell on the ball on the Red Devil 4 yard line.

Miller followed the blocking of his linemen as he sneaked into the end zone for his second touchdown of the night. Hager split the uprights again and Norton led 35-2.

After Hager's kickoff, Oberlin was able to earn four first downs before they ran out of time and the visiting Norton team prevailed.

Brooks gained 41 yards on 16 carries for a 2.4 yard average, followed by Bohl, 9 for 29; Miller, 6 for 22; Furbush, 1 for 6.

Miller completed 6 of 16 passes for 40 yards; Ellis completed 1 for 3 yards.

Pass receivers were Ellis, 2 for 20; Risewick, 1 for 9; Unterseher, 1 for 8; Bohl, 1 for 6; Furbush, 1 for 3; Brooks, 1 for minus 3.

Brooks punted 5 times for a 36.6 yard average; Hager kicked off 6 times for a 48.5 yard average.

Furbush had 1 kickoff return for 20 yards and 1 punt return for 6 yards. Brooks had 1 punt return for 38 yards.

Kennedy Fortin was leading rusher for Oberlin with 41 yards on 13 carries; Dayton Dreher had 30 yards on 15 carries.

Leading tackler for Norton was Eli Bozarth with 6 solos and 5 assists. Carson McKenna and

The Norton girls placed ninth out of 28 teams and 211 runners and the Norton boys finished 15th out of 34 teams and 246 runners.

The top five girls teams were Smithville, Mo., 60, first; Frontier Academy, Colo., 111, second; St. James Academy, 208, third; Grain Valley, Mo., 208, fourth; Pembrooke Hill, Mo., 211, fifth.

The top five boys teams were Christ Prep, 84, first; Frontier Academy, Colo., 144, second; Ellinwood, 164, third; St. James Academy, 213, fourth; Andale, 217, fifth.

NORTON GIRLS

Norton sophomore Sierra Griffith was fastest for the Lady Jays, placing 54th in 17:14, followed by junior Darcy Bainter, 67th, 17:27; freshman Molly Maddy, 76th, 17:40; junior Katelyn Engelbert, 80th, 17:45 and junior Marisa Maddy, 91st, 17:52.

Also running for Norton and their places and times were: senior Kamilla Jones, 102nd, 18:01 and senior Julia Kent, 119th, 18:18.

"Today was a mixed day; the race was extremely competitive," said coach Rossi.

"While finishing in the top ten out of 28 teams is good, our girls were disappointed in their showing today.

"This race is a fantastic indicator of weaknesses and we saw several today. How we use this race to prepare for the rest of the season remains to be seen.

"We have been running very well of late and this race brought us back to earth, which I think is exactly what we needed to help us get ready for the second half of the season.

"Sierra and Kamilla improved their times from last year's race and Molly ran a very tough second half of the race.

"The good thing about this team is each individual will work to make themselves and their team better. They have shown this time and time again."

Norton junior Alec Hager hit the finish line first for Norton in 18:06 to place 53rd, followed by junior Marc Miller, 67th, 18:16; freshman Brendon Frack, 68th, 18:18; sophomore Dalton Vanover, 115th, 19:02 and senior John Renner, 211th, 20:50.

Also running for the Blue Jays and their places and times were: senior Ryan Bainter, 225th, 21:22 and junior Keith Sander, 242nd, 22:45.

"The boys race was huge with 34 teams and 246 runners completing the tough Rim Rock Farm course," said coach Rossi.

"Alec, Marc and Dalton each improved their time by an average of about 47 seconds from last year's race and also improved their place by about 40 places each.

"Ryan Bainter also improved his time by 50 seconds from last year. Brendon Frack continues to run very well as a freshman.

"Our boys started out good and most of them hit a rough patch on the second steep hill but, all in all, finished very well, passing quite a few in the last 800 meters.

"As with the girls, we learned quite a lot about ourselves today. We need to work on speed



in the second and third mile and attacking the uphill."

Next action

Norton competed in the annual Oberlin Invitational Cross Country Meet on Tuesday but results were not available at the Norton Telegram's press time.

That will be the only meet for Norton until the annual Mid-Continent League meet which will be held Thursday, Oct. 4 at Phillipsburg, beginning at 4:30 p.m.
