"We didn't play well the first game as we had to come from behind but we are very happy we could do that.


"Our second game was much better as we played much more aggressive and got out to an early lead and then held on for the win to advance to Saturday's league tournament.

JV football team outscores Hays, 26-18

The Norton junior varsity scored on their first possession. They drove the length of the field with junior tailback Austin Hager scoring with 6:11 left in the first quarter. No extra points were added and Norton led 6-0.

Hays scored with :03 left in the first period but the Norton defense stopped their extra points try and the score remained 6-6.

Neither team was able to score in the second quarter, leaving the score tied 6-6 at halftime.

Hays took a 12-6 lead with 5:49 left in the third quarter but their extra point kick failed. Junior Tanner Furbush returned the Indian kickoff over 75 yards for another Blue Jay touchdown! Norton was unable to score extra points and the score was tied again, this time at 12-all.

Not content with a two-point lead, the Norton offense took the kickoff and drove the length of the field for another touchdown with 5:23 left. Sophomore fullback Stewart Whitney scored on an inside run. The attempt for extra points was stopped but Norton had extended their lead

After the kickoff, the Blue Jay defense held the Indians to fourand-out, then the offense ran the clock out on the ground for the 26-18 victory.

The freshmen contest was held prior to the junior varsity game. Hays kicked off to Norton and held the Jays, forcing them to punt. Hays moved downfield and scored with 6:51 left in the first quarter. They added two points on a pass and led 8-0.
