

Huskies compete in six man action and get a win

The Northern Valley Junior High School football team is on a roll, winning its third straight game in a high scoring affair, 70-42, in a six man game over Grinnell/Wheatland on Thursday, Oct. 4.

The Huskies were led on offense by eighth grader Drake Shearer's five touchdowns. Defensively, seventh grader Caden Kinderknecht led the charge with 12 solo tackles, four assists and two fumble recoveries. Eighth grader Carson Wallace put his stamp on the game as well, scoring touchdowns on offense, defense and special teams.

In the first quarter, the Huskies wasted no time getting on the board. Shearer dove in from the one yard line. Kinderknecht rushed for the 2-point conversion, 8-0 Huskies.

The Huskies defense forced the Thunderhawks to punt and Wallace took it to the house, 44 yards in all on the punt return, 14-0 Huskies.

With the Thunderhawks driving deep into Husky territory the defense came up big. Wallace intercepted a pass and went 68 yards for the score. Briely Yocum scored the 2-point conversion on a pass from Shearer, 22-0 Huskies.

In the second quarter, the Huskies went to the passing game

and found the end zone three times. First, Shearer dialed in on eighth grader Damian Wellman for a 35 yard touchdown pass. Wallace ran for the 2-point conversion, 30-0 Huskies. Then it was Shearer connecting with Wallace for a 17 yard touchdown strike. Kinderknecht scored the conversion, 38-0 Huskies.

The Thunderhawks struck back with a 26 yard touchdown pass from Chandler Ostmeyer to Cory Prewo. Ostmeyer completed a pass to Tustin for the 2-point conversion, cutting the lead to 38-8.

The Huskies answered back with a 14 yard touchdown pass from Shearer to seventh grader Briely Yocum. Shearer added the conversion, 46-8 Huskies.

The Thunderhawks scored on

the ensuing kickoff. Prewo navigated his way 65 yards for the score and cutting the Huskies halftime lead to 46-14.

In the third quarter, Wallace had another interception for a touchdown. The pick six was returned 29 yards and Kinderknecht ran for the 2-point conversion, 54-14 Huskies.

The Thunderhawks had plenty of fight left in them however. Prewo broke free on a 34 yard touchdown run and he scored the conversion on a pass reception from Ostmeyer, Thunderhawks trailed 54-22.

Ostmeyer followed up with a 15 yard touchdown run of his own. Ostmeyer passed for the

2-point conversion and the Thunderhawks trailed by 24 points to start the fourth quarter.

The Huskies went back to the ground game. Shearer scored on an 11 yard run and Kinderknecht passed to Wallace for the conversion, 62-30 Huskies

The Thunderhawks weren't done fighting though. Julien Illo broke through the Huskies defense for a 50 yard touchdown run, 62-36 Huskies.

Kinderknecht closed out the Huskies scoring barrage with a nine yard touchdown run. Seventh grader Keegan Smith scored the 2-point conversion, 70-36 Huskies.

The Thunderhawks padded the scoreboard with a 60 yard kickoff return for a touchdown but it wouldn't be enough, as Northern Valley routed Grinnell/Wheatland, 70-42, for its third straight victory and a 3-2 overall record.

“The Huskies came out ready to play building a 38-0 lead midway through the second quarter,” said Huskies head coach Jim Cole.

Offensively, Drake Shearer rushed eight time for 78 yards, two touchdowns and one 2-point conversion. Kinderknecht rushed 10 times for 40 yards, one touchdown and three 2-point conversions, and Wallace added 101 yards on 10 rushes and one 2-point conversion.

Shearer went 4 for 4 passing for 69 yards and three touchdowns and one 2-point conversion. Kinderknecht went 1 for 2 passing for three yards and one 2-point conversion.

Receiving, Wallace had two receptions for 20 yards, one touchdown and one 2-point conversion, Yocum had two receptions for 17 yards, one touchdown and one 2-point conversion, and Wellman had one reception for 35 yards and a touchdown.

Defensively, Kinderknecht was the Huskies leading tackler with 12 solo tackles, four assists and two fumble recoveries, and Wallace racked up 11 solo tackles, four assists and three interceptions, two of which went for touchdowns.

Northern Valley earns fourth victory

The Northern Valley Junior High School Huskies earned their fourth victory in a row with a 40 point win, 66-26, over the Golden Plains Bulldogs on Thursday, Oct. 11 in Rexford.

The Bulldogs scored first when Dawson Spreser found the end zone from the four yard line, 6-0 Bulldogs.

Seventh grade running back Caden Kinderknecht responded with an eight yard touchdown run of his own. Carson Wallace rushed for the 2-point conversion, 8-6 Huskies.

In the second quarter, seventh grade receiver Briely Yocum was on the receiving end of eighth grade quarterback Drake Shearer's 23 yard touchdown pass. Kinderknecht added the conversion, 16-6 Huskies.

Then, eighth grade running back Carson Wallace showed his big play ability, breaking free on a 45 yard punt return for a touchdown. Wallace passed to Kinderknecht for the conversion, 24-6 Huskies.

Before the half, Wallace made another big play. This time on the ground for a 61 yard touchdown. Kinderknecht rushed for the 2-point conversion and the Huskies took a commanding 32-6 lead into halftime.

The Huskies opened the third quarter by attacking the Bulldogs defense through the air.

Shearer went deep and found eighth grade receiver Damian Wellman for a 40 yard touchdown pass. Wallace rushed for the conversion, 40-6 Huskies.

Despite being down big Golden Plains fought back. Dawson Spreser capped a Bulldogs drive with a five yard touchdown run, 40-12 the Bulldogs trailed.

Wellman closed out the third quarter with another big play. Wellman eluded the Bulldogs defense for a 42 yard touchdown run. Kinderknecht passed to Shearer for the conversion, 48-12 Huskies.

Start of the fourth quarter, Wallace followed up on Wellman's effort with a 45 yard touchdown run of his own and the Huskies pulled away, 54-12.

However, the Bulldogs and Spreser didn't give up. Spreser cut through the Huskies defense on his way to the end zone and a 55 yard run, Bulldogs trailed 54-18.

But the Huskies offense was too potent for the Bulldogs defense. Eighth grade receiver John Towery hauled in a 47 yard touchdown pass from Kinderknecht and the Huskies led by 42 points, 60-18.

Late in the fourth quarter, Golden Plains running back Jesus Aragon scored on a 25 yard run. Spreser added the conversion and the Bulldogs trailed

60-26. The Huskies ended the high scoring affair with another big play. Kinderknecht scored on a 46 yard run to seal Northern Valley's 66-26 victory over the Golden Plains Bulldogs.

The Huskies were led in rushing by Carson Wallace with 112 yards on four carries, two touchdowns and two 2-point conversions. Caden Kinderknecht had five rushes for 61 yards, two touchdowns and two 2-point conversions, and Damian Wellman had two rushes for 49 yards and a touchdown.

The passing game was very efficient. Drake Shearer was two for three passing for 63 yards and two touchdowns. Kinderknecht went three for four passing for 53 yards and one touchdown and two 2-point conversions.

The Huskies receivers made the most of their limited opportunities. John Towery had one reception for 47 yards and one touchdown, Damian Wellman had one reception for 40 yards and one touchdown, and Briely Yocum had one reception for 23 yards and one touchdown.

On defense, the Huskies top tacklers were Briely Yocum with 12 tackles and five assists, Carson Wallace had 10 tackles and six assists, and Drake Shearer added nine tackles and 10 assists.

“With the win the Huskies finished in second place in the Western Kansas Liberty League,” said Huskies head coach Jim Cole.

Northern Valley's only league loss was to Logan/Damar back on Sept. 6.
