Norton cross country had a great season

Tremendous seasons are becoming a tradition for the Norton Community High School girls and boys cross country teams who had another fabulous record in 2012 under the guidance of fourth year head coach George Rossi.

For the second straight year, the Lady Jays finished runner-up in the Class 3A State Cross Country Meet at Rim Rock Farm near Lawrence and the Blue Jay boys moved up from fourth a year ago to a solid third place finish.

Along the way, the Norton girls earned seven meet championships and the Blue Jay boys won three meet championships with two runner-up places.

The Norton girls were Mid-Continent League cross country champions for the fifth year in a row and the Blue Jays boys won the league crown for the ninth year in a row!

The Lady Jays were winners of the Norton Invitational for the seventh year in a row and the Norton boys were champions for the fourth straight year.
