Norton Blue Jays win **Hoxie Wrestling Tourney**

the championship of the annual Hoxie Invitational Tournament. The Blue Jays amassed a score of 166.5 to outscore sec-

ond place Oberlin by 14.5 points. The Red Devils tallied 152 points and Plainville placed third with 139. They were followed by Scott City, 108; Hoxie, 101; Oakley, 77; Cimarron, 77; Holcomb, 63; Lakin, 31; Trego Community, 8.

Norton entered 10 of the 14 weight classes and captured five individual championships, had two second place finishes and one third place.

The Blue Jays had 22 wins and just 7 losses. Their pin ratio was 14-5.

"We exceeded all expectations," said coach Johnson of his team's initial performance of the season. "It's only a start but we are ahead of where we thought we'd be this early in the season. We must not get overconfident because we still have a long way to go.

"We saved the best for the finals where we won some battles we weren't expected to win."


