Norton boys basketball season opens with a win

Coach Doug Reusink's Norton Community High School boys basketball team opened their 2012-13 season with an impressive 48-35 win over Goodland on Friday evening in the NCHS Stull Gym.

Defense was the name of the game for the Blue Jays as they limited the visiting Cowboys to 8 or less points in three quarters. Goodland's best scoring quarter was the third when they hit just four field goals but all four were three-pointers.

Goodland actually led 8-5 after a first quarter which saw them hit two shots from beyond the arc in addition to a two-point basket. Norton's only first quarter points came on a three-pointer by senior forward Andrew Ellis and a two-point basket by senior guard Jacob Brooks.

The Norton defense held Goodland to just 8 more points in the second quarter while the Blue Jays put together their best quarter of the game by scoring 17 points to take a 22-16 lead at intermission. Senior forward Dalton Miller scored his first points of the season by swishing four baskets while Brooks hit a two and a three-pointer and Ellis and senior forward Lane Bigge each hit twopoint shots.

Goodland came out in the third period and played Norton on even terms, outscoring the Blue Jays 13-11 to cut Norton's lead to 33-29 with one period left. Ellis hit another three and a two point shot, Bigge swished two more baskets and junior forward Tanner Furbush hit a two-pointer.

The Cowboys concentrated on fouling in the fourth quarter in an attempt to get the ball but the strategy did not work. The Blue Jays hit 11 free throws as they outscored the visitors 15-6 to win

Brooks went to the charity stripe the most for Norton in the final period, swishing 6 of 8 free throws in addition to hitting one basket. Miller hit another basket and two charities. Ellis, Bigge and sophomore center Conor Cox each hit a free

"We played great defensively and did a great job on the boards," said coach Reusink. "We also had a real team effort offensively. Jacob was not shooting the ball very well but the rest of the players stepped up and helped the cause."

Brooks led Norton in scoring with 15 points. He hit 1 of 9 three point shots for 11 percent, 3 of 10 two-point tries for 30 percent and 4 of 19 overall for 21 percent. He swished 6 of 8 free throws, however, for 75 percent.

Two other Norton players scored in double figures. Miller tallied 12 points on 5 of 8 from the field for 63 percent and 2 of 2 from the charity

Ellis finished with 11 points on 2 of 5 from beyond the arc for 40 percent, 2 of 3 two-point attempts for 67 percent and 4 of 8 overall for 50 percent. He was 1 of 2 from the line.

Despite trailing 16-7 after one quarter, 24-9 at halftime and 37-16 after three periods, coach Rossi's Lady Jays played even with the visitors in the fourth quarter where they were outscored 12-11.
