Lady Jays boost their win record against Cambridge

The Norton Community High School girls varsity basketball team extended their early season record to 5-2 with a 59-26 win over Cambridge on Tuesday

evening, Dec. 18 in the NCHS

Stull Gym in Norton. The score was tied at 7-all with 3:00 left in the first quarter but the Lady Jays outscored the Lady Trojans the rest of the way. Norton held quarter leads

of 13-8, 24-13 and 42-17.

Norton led Cambridge in every category, except free throws, which was a non-factor in the outcome. Field goal shooting was exceptional as the Lady Jays hit 25 of 54 shots for 46 percent compared to 11 of 37 for 30 percent for Cambridge.

Norton's shooting percentage was helped tremendously by junior Bailey Ambrosier's perfect shooting night from the floor. Ambrosier's only points in the

first half were two free throws but she hit 7 of 7 field goals after intermission to end the game with 16 points.

Senior point guard Tawni Griffey, who normally leads the Lady Jays in points, was second high with 12 points, which included two baskets from beyond the arc.

"We started slow but it was a good win going into the holiday break," said head coach George Rossi. "Our girls have gotten some confidence they didn't have at the start of the season.

"We're doing things now in games that we talk about in

"We played quite a few girls and had no letdowns. Everybody stepped up. When other girls came in, we just kept click-

"We're going in the right direction right now."

As a team, Norton hit 4 of 15 trey tries for 27 percent, 21 of 39 two-point attempts for 54 percent and 25 of 54 overall for 46 percent. Cambridge missed three shots from beyond the arc, swished 11 of 34 two-point tries for 32 percent and was 11 of 37 overall for 30 percent.

From the free throw line, Norton connected on 5 of 11 for 45 percent and Cambridge hit 4 of 6 for 67 percent.

Norton pulled down 13 offensive and 15 defensive rebounds for 28 total. Cambridge grabbed 9 offensive and 14 defensive caroms for 23 total.

Leading rebounder for the Lady Jays was Katelyn Engelbert with 10, followed by Griffey, 5; Ambrosier, 5; Alec Melvin, 3; Darcy Bainter, 2; Katie Bohl, 2; Johnnye Ruder,

Norton's aggressive defense stole the ball 15 times compared to 8 thefts by the Lady Trojans.

The opportunistic Norton defense also caused 32 turnovers

while the Lady Jays gave up the ball themselves just 18 times.
