Blue Jays win Jake Durham Tournament

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com After tying for fourth place a year ago, the Norton Community High School varsity wrestling team won the championship of the 48th annual J.R. Durham Wrestling Tournament held Saturday in the NCHS Stull Gym in Norton.

Prior to 2012, the Blue Jays had won seven consecutive championships of the tough tournament which honors former NCHS wrestling coach J.R. "Jake" Durham and former state medalists.

The Blue Jays compiled 130.5 points to win the championship, followed by Plainville, 123; Hoxie, 104; Ulysses, 102.5; Cozad, 99; Scott City, 94; Smith Center, 84.5; Beloit, 76.5; Atwood, 61.5; Oakley, 55.5; Mc-Cook, 34; Leoti, 32; Cimarron, 26; Lakin, 12; Thomas More Prep-Hays, 9; Tribune, 2.

Norton had six wrestlers in championship matches with three of them earning titles. Blue Jay champions were sophomore Caysean Campbell, 106; senior John Risewick, 132 and sophomore Jared Tallent, 138.

Finishing runner-up were junior Ethan Ross, 113; junior Alec Hager, 126 and junior Cody Ellis, 152.

Norton had no third or fourth place finishers.

Freshman Gavin Lively, 145 and junior Kolton Harting, 182, each placed fifth although they received no recognition or points.

Also wrestling for the Blue Jays were junior Branson Addington, 120; senior Jared Bohl, 160; freshman Chandler Sumner, 195 and junior Andre Valencia, 220.

Norton was open at 170 and 285 pounds.

Norton had a 19-15 won-loss record and a 10-8 pin ratio.

Calvin Ochs, Hoxie, was voted the "Outstanding Wrestler".

Wrestlers headed to Newton

The Norton wrestlers will face their biggest challenge of the season this Friday and Saturday when they compete in the prestigious 50th annual Newton Wrestling Tournament of Champions in Newton.

A total of 27 teams will compete in the tournament. In addition to Norton and Newton, the teams are: Andover Central, Ark City, Bishop Carroll, Blue Valley Southwest, Colby, Derby, Dodge City, Emporia, Fredonia, Garden City, Gardner-Edgerton, Grand Island, Neb., Hutchin-

son, Lawrence, Leavenworth, Liberal, Maize, Maize South, Manhattan, McPherson, Mill Valley, Newton, Salina South, Wichita East, Wichita Heights and Wichita Northwest.

Norton is the smallest enrollment school to ever win the Newton tournament championship. The Blue Jays won the team title in 2005 and 2006 and did not compete in 2007 due to inclement weather. In 2008 and 2009 Norton finished ninth as a team and in 2010 placed fifth out of the 25 teams competing. In 2011, the Blue Jays turned in an outstanding fourth place

finish. Last year, Norton placed 17th but only entered nine wrestlers due to injuries.

Wrestling will begin at 11 a.m. on Friday and 9 a.m. on Saturday.

Admission is \$7 for adults and \$5 for students K-12 per session. A two-day adult ticket is \$12 and two-day children's ticket is \$8.
