## Statistics from an excellent football season

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Norton Community High School head football coach Lucas Melvin has released the statistics for the Blue Jays' excellent 7-3 season.

As a team, Norton rushed for 1,899 yards on 421 carries for an excellent average of 4.5 yards per carry. The Jays also passed for 1,151 yards for a grand total of 3,050 yards of offense!

Senior tailback Jacob Brooks was leading individual rusher for Norton, gaining 1,162 yards on 188 carries for an average of 6.2 yards per carry.

Other rushers for Norton included: senior fullback Jared Bohl, 67 for 285 yards, 4.3

yard average; senior quarterback Dalton Miller, 117 for 281 yards, 2.4 average; junior running back Tanner Furbush, 42 for 156 yards, 3.7 average; sophomore running back Jared Tallent, 4 for 17, 4.3 average.

Quarterback Miller completed 63 of 135 passes for 1,057 yards and 13 touchdowns for a 47 percent completion rate.

Brooks was his leading receiver with 10 catches for 306 yards, an average of 30.6, followed by senior tight end Carson McKenna, 18 catches for 265 yards, an average of 14.7; senior wide receiver Andrew Ellis, 18 for 212 yards, an average of 11.8; senior wide receiver John Risewick, 9 for 196, an average of 21.8; Bohl, 5 for 26, an average of 5.5; Furbush, 3 for 90, an average of 30; Kobie Unterseher, 1 for 8; Eli Bozarth, 1 for 1. Brooks was the punter for

Norton, averaging 36.54 yards per kick with a longest of 60

Brooks returned 7 punts for 80 yards, an average of 11.4 and Furbush returned 6 punts for 80 yards, an average of 13.3. Risewick returned 1 punt for 2.

Furbush led in kickoff returns with 16 for 288 yards and an average of 18. Brooks returned 7 kickoffs for 150 yards and a 21.4 average.

From his defensive back position, Brooks intercepted 3 passes for 19 yards. Cornerback McKenna also intercepted three aerials for 29 total yards. Lucas Engel had 1 interception for 37 yards and Austin Hager had 1 for 28 yards. Andrew Ellis and John Risewick also had one pass interception each.

Brooks also blocked 2 kicks. Senior end Eli Bozarth had 2 fumble recoveries. Brooks

had 2. Jared Bohl had 2. Carson McKenna had 2 and Lucas Engel had 2, followed by Cole Renner, 1; Lane Bigge, 1; Stewart Whitney, 1; Dylan Sprigg, 1; Austin Hager, 1.

Brooks was scoring leader with 102 total points, followed by Miller, 42; Hager, 39; Furbush, 32; Ellis, 12; McKenna,

12; Risewick, 8; Bohl, 6; Kobie Unterseher, 6.

Leading tackler for Norton was senior linebacker Treven Rossi with 53 solo tackles, 22 assists for 75 total stops. Second high tackler was senior linebacker Jared Bohl with 41 solos, 26 assists for 67 total. Third high tackler was senior cornerback Carson McKenna with 52 solos, 13 assists for 65 total and fourth high was senior end Eli Bozarth with 35 solos, 25 assists for 60 total. Right behind him was senior safety John Risewick with 39 solos, 20 assists, 59 total.

They were followed by senior tackle Lucas Engel, 32 solos, 18 assists, 50 total; senior safety Jacob Brooks, 39 solos, 8 assists, 47 total; junior cornerback Austin Hager, 34 solos, 12 assists, 46 total; junior end Cole Renner, 20 solos, 21 assists, 41 total; senior tackle Lane Bigge, 24 solos, 10 assists, 34 total; sophomore noseguard Stewart Whitney, 12 solos, 14 assists, 26 total; junior linebacker Tanner Furbush, 18 solos, 8 assists, 26 total.

Austin Hager was Norton's kicker. He was successful on 21 of 29 extra point kicks for 72 percent accuracy. He also was successful on 6 of 8 field goal tries for 75 percent accuracy.

Hager kicked off 47 times for 2,073 yards and an average of 44 yards per kickoff.

Leading scorer for Oakley was Mason Scheetz with 14 points; Brandyn VanEaton added 12.

"This was an excellent win for us," said coach Stover. "As opposed to the first game of the tournament, we were able to get a great start and earn a quick lead. We played well throughout the game and so did Oakley. They made a comeback in the final minutes of regulation and, with a basket at the buzzer, were able to force overtime.


