Wrestlers do well against larger schools at Newton

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com Norton Community High School was the smallest enrollment school competing in the prestigious 50th annual Newton Wrestling Tournament of Champions in Newton last Friday and Saturday but the Blue Jays' partial team proved once again that they are capable of wrestling against the larger schools in the

Coach Bill Johnson entered just nine wrestlers in the 14 weight classes.

Norton, the smallest school to ever win this tough tournament, placed 15th out of 27 teams.

Grand Island, Neb. entered the tournament for the first time and won the championship with 243 points. In a distant second was Arkansas City with 178, followed by Newton, 152.5; Garden City, 152; Colby, 128.5; Andover Central, 124; Manhattan, 123; Derby, 106; Emporia, 97.5; Wichita Northwest, 91.5; Gardner-Edgerton, 88.5; Leavenworth, 82; Lawrence, 74; Blue Valley Southwest, 69; Norton, 62; Mill Valley, 59; Bishop Carroll, 58; Fredonia, 55.5; Wichita Heights, 55; Dodge City, 53.5; Maize, 45.5; Liberal, 44; Salina South, 38; McPherson, 30.5; Maize South, 27; Wichita East, 24; Hutchinson, 21.5.

The Blue Jays won the team title in 2005 and 2006 and did not compete in 2007 due to inclement weather. In 2008 and 2009, Norton finished ninth as a team and in 2010 the Blue Jays placed fifth.

In 2011, Norton had a stellar fourth place finish.

Four of the Norton wrestlers placed in the tournament. Senior John Risewick placed fourth at 132, sophomore Jared Tallent finished eighth at 138, junior Kolton Harting finished eighth at 182 and senior Lucas Engel placed eighth at 220.

Also competing for Norton and their records were Caysean Campbell, 106, 1-2 record; Branson Addington, 120, 2-2 record; junior Alec Hager, 126, 2-2 record; senior Cody Ellis, 145, 1-2 record and senior Jared Bohl, 152, 2-2 record.

Kolton Harting was named Norton's "Outstanding Wrestler of the Week" by the Norton coaches for his performance.

Norton had a 19-21 won-loss record and an 11-6 pin ratio.

Named "Outstanding Wrestler" of the Tournament was 120 pound champion Zac Gentzler, Andover Central.

"Every year this tournament gets tougher and tougher," said Norton head wrestling coach Bill Johnson. "New team Grand Island added many talented wrestlers to the mix and their three time defending state championship team ran away with the team title.

"We entered nine wrestlers.

Ethan Ross was scheduled to wrestle but a slight elbow injury ruled it unwise for him to compete in a tournament of this

"After Friday's wrestling ended, I was not at all happy with our performance, especially our hustle and lack of ability to stay positive in a very tough match.

"For the most part, our young men bounced back on Saturday and won several matches in a row to either secure a top eight finish or, in the case of two, come just one match away.

John Risewick

John Risewick was seeded No.3. He pinned Danial Wilson, Leavenworth, in 4:19; won a 5-4 decision over Kendall Biddle, Ark City, before losing a 3-1 decision to Sawyer Like, Blue Valley Southwest. In the consolation bracket, he pinned Anthony Monares, Newton, in 4:52 before losing a 3-0 decision to Tevin Briscoe, Garden City, to place fourth.

"Briscoe was a familiar foe for John," said coach Johnson. "The tight match saw Briscoe escape and Risewick did not. Failure to get escapes in big matches continues to be a problem for many of our wrestlers. That will be an area that we can focus on heading into the regional tournament.'

Jared Tallent

Jared was unseeded at 138 pounds and placed eighth.

"That is an excellent finish in an extremely tough bracket," said coach Johnson. "He started the tournament by losing a very exciting 9-3 decision to unbeaten No.1 seed and eventual champion Brogan Humphrey of Fre-

"Most of the coaches considered this one of the deepest brackets in the tournament. Jared opened a lot of eyes with his close matches against the best wrestlers in the state regardless of classification. "

After losing the first match, Jared pinned Josh Mullin, Manhattan, in 4:56; pinned Corey Campos, Liberal, in 4:13; won a 3-1 decision over Macen Shull, Colby; lost a 3-2 decision to Jared Suppes, Derby and lost a 2-1 decision to Bryan Burnett, Mill Valley, to place eighth.

Kolton Harting

Kolton was unseeded at 182 pounds. "He lost to the eventual fourth place winner, then came alive on the back side of the bracket," said coach Johnson. "He won three straight matches before losing to the eventual third place finisher and losing a double overtime match."

Kolton was pinned in 1:59 by Haris Talundzic, Grand Island; pinned Kyle Harp, Wichita Heights, in 1:27; pinned Jay Zeigelmeier, Colby, in 1:53; won a 6-0 decision over Juan Carlos Rodriguez, Garden City; was pinned in 3:09 by Emilio Fowler, Gardner-Edgerton and lost a double overtime 2-1 decision to Sage Eckman, Emporia, to place eighth.

Lucas Engel

Lucas was also unseeded at 220 pounds. "Like Tallent, Lucas lost his first match to the eventual champion," said coach Johnson. "On the back side of the bracket, he received a bye and followed that up with two nice wins to put him in the consolation quarterfinals. He dropped his final two matches to finish eighth."

Lucas lost a 12-0 major decision to Edgar Silva, Grand Island; pinned Vincent Dixon, Wichita Heights, in 4:40; won a 1-0 decision over Matt Kissinger, Derby; was pinned in :58 by Anthony Fitchett, Blue Valley Southwest and was pinned in 2:30 by Anthony Gonzalez, Fredonia, to place eighth.

Caysean Campbell

Caysean Campbell won his first 106 pound match by pinning Rylan Kasitz, Salina South, in 3:08; was pinned in 3:46 by Braden Dipman, Derby and lost a 12-2 major decision to Justin Onmugoufor, Witchita North-

Branson Addington

Branson Addington won his first match by a 9-2 decision over Thomas Burton, Wichita East; lost a 16-1 technical fall to No.1 seed unbeaten Zac Gentzler, Andover Central; pinned Tim

Thongone, Lawrence, in 2:33 and lost an 8-5 decision to Jesse Bashor, Maize South.

Alec Hager

Alec Hager won a 7-1 decision over Garrett Girard, Lawrence; pinned Blaise Albers, Salina South, in 1:24; lost a 4-3 decision to Brett Moon, Maize and lost a 9-3 decision to Garrett Whitson, Emporia.

Cody Ellis lost an 8-2 decision to Paul Suhr, Andover Central; won a 3-1 decision over Jhett Ostrom, Dodge City and lost a 3-2 decision to Josh Owings, Maize.

Jared Bohl was pinned in 2:40 by Ryan Bellinger, Lawrence; pinned Nick Murillo, Hutchinson. in 1:29; won a 14-0 major decision over Jay Page, Andover Central and lost an 8-2 decision to Michael Leeper, Manhattan.


