A hard fought dual ends in loss for Norton

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The Norton Community High School and Colby High School wrestling teams, two of the top ranked teams in the state of Kansas, met in a dual Thursday in Wilmeth Kirk Memorial Gym in Norton and the Eagles came out on top 42-31.

Colby is ranked No.1 in the state in Class 4A and Norton is ranked No.2 in Class 3-2-1A.

It was a hard fought dual that was not decided until the final matches.

Norton won six matches and Colby won eight but one match especially could have gone either way. That was at 145 where Gavin Lively was dominating Kyle Finley by a 13-5 score and the official said Lively was pinned on what appeared to be an out-of-bounds move.

"I was really proud of the

way we came out and competed hard," said Norton head coach Bill Johnson. "The 145 pound match was pivotal but you can't put the team loss on one match.

"We were missing three varsity wrestlers but we went at them nose to nose. We have good backups and that really helps us.

"We're getting better and that's very important."

In recognition of his major decision win at 138 pounds, Jared Tallent was chosen by Norton coaches as the "Norton Wrestler of the Week".



Norton avenges previous loss and defeats Wakeeney

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The No.6 seeded Norton Community High School boys basketball team avenged a loss in WaKeeney in regular season play on Friday, Jan. 11 with a 45-38 overtime win over the No.7 seeded Golden Eagles in Mid-Continent League Tournament consolation play on Thursday evening in Plainville.

In the first encounter, Norton fell far behind in the first quarter and, despite playing Trego even the rest of the way, could never catch up. This time around, the game was close from the start, regulation ended in a tie and the Blue Jays prevailed in the extra period.

"We struggled all night on the offensive end but we got some big free throws and a couple of big baskets in overtime to get the win," said coach Doug Reu-

"I felt our defense gave a consistent effort most of the night and came up big late in the game."

Norton led 12-10 after one quarter which saw Andrew Ellis hit a three-point basket and free throw, Drew Schrum drain a trey, Tanner Furbush hit a basket and two charities and Jacob Brooks hit one free toss.

Norton was outscored 11-7 in the second period to trail slightly 21-19 at halftime. The Blue Jays' points in the quarter came on another three-point basket by Ellis and two-pointers by Carson McKenna and Lane Bigge.

Norton outscored Trego 12-7 in the third quarter to take a 31-28 lead into the fourth period. Norton's third quarter points were well distributed with John Renner, Schrum, Ellis, Dalton Miller, Furbush and McKenna

each hitting one basket.

The hard-fought fourth period ended in a 34-all tie. Norton's only points came on a basket and free throw by Miller. Trego also hit just one basket in the fourth quarter but hit four charities to tie the score.

Drew Schrum demonstrated the value of free throws in the overtime. He started the extra period by hitting two free throws and hit five more in a row until missing one. Schrum's 7 points were the difference as the Blue Jays' other four points came on baskets by Furbush and Brooks. Normally the Blue Jays' high scorer, Brooks' basket in overtime was his only one of the

Schrum had five points on a trey and a two point basket prior to the overtime and ended as Norton's leading scorer. He hit 1 of 5 from long range for 20

percent, 1 of 2 two-point shots for 50 percent and 2 of 7 overall for 29 percent but, most importantly, he was 7 of 8 from the free throw line for 88 percent accuracy.

Leading scorer for Trego was John Griffith with 19 points.

Although the Blue Jays were outshot from the field, they made up for it by outrebounding Trego, outshooting them from the charity stripe, blocking many more shots and stealing the ball many more times than

As a team, Norton hit 3 of 19 from beyond the arc for 16 percent, 12 of 38 two-point attempts for 32 percent and 15 of 57 overall for 26 percent. Trego scored on 3 of 10 from long range for 30 percent, 12 of 21 two-point tries for 57 percent and 15 of 31 overall for 48 per-

Thanks to Schrum, Norton swished 12 of 17 free throws for 71 percent accuracy and Trego hit 5 of 8 for 63 percent. The Blue Jays pulled down

11 offensive, 12 defensive rebounds for 23 total compared to 5 offensive, 13 defensive for 18 total by the Golden Eagles. Furbush was leading rebound-

er for Norton with 6 boards, followed by Bigge, 4; Brooks, 3; Ellis, 3; Schrum, 2; Miller, 2; McKenna, 2; Conor Cox, 1. Norton set a season high in

blocks by rejecting 10 Trego shots. Brooks was the leader with 6 blocks, followed by Ellis, 2; Schrum, Miller, 1 each. The very aggressive Norton

defense also recorded 13 steals compared to just 2 by Trego! Brooks and Schrum each had 4 thefts, McKenna had 3 and Miller and Furbush, 1 each.

Brooks had 4 of Norton's 8

offensive assists, followed by Miller, 2; Ellis, 1; McKenna, 1.
