Senior night successful for Blue Jays

win over Goodland in the final dual of the season on Friday night in the Wilmeth Kirk Memorial Gym in Norton.

Honored along with their parents prior to the start of wrestling were Blue Jay seniors John

Risewick, 132; Cody Ellis, 145; Jared Bohl, 152; Lucas Engel, 220 and Eli Bozarth, injured.

It was the final action for No.3 state ranked Norton prior to the tough Class 3-2-1A Regional Wrestling Tournament, which will be held in Norton this Friday and Saturday, Feb. 15-16.

Norton won their first five matches and built up a 38-0 lead before the Cowboys were able to score any points.

"I'm proud of us for jumping out to a big lead," said Norton head coach Bill Johnson.

"We put the dual out of reach early but didn't do so good after the 145 pound match.

"We still need to work on getting off bottom. We were ridden for two minutes straight in several matches.

"Now, the stage is set. We will have just three hard practices before the Regional Tournament. It will be nice for our wrestlers to stay in Norton for this very tough tournament. Hosting the tournament has its advantages but also disadvantages. It's a lot of work for our people to host it."

All 11 of the Norton wrestlers entered medaled and 10 of them were in the finals.

No team scores were kept for the junior varsity competition but Norton would have finished ahead of the other teams if scores had been kept.

Winning championships for Norton were Skylar Johnson, 106; Riley Hager, 120; Derek Rowh, 132; Toby Nickell, 138; Chandler Sumner, 195.

Finishing runner-up were

Gavin Lively placed third at 152 pounds.

"I was very proud of our performance," said Norton assistant coach Shane Miller. "This is a testament to the type of schedule we keep with our junior varsity team. Most teams don't get as much competition as our junior varsity wrestlers do and it showed. You could definitely tell our preparation is above the others.

"There are some traditionally good teams that enter the Panther Classic and we proved that we have some good young wrestlers waiting in the wings to be varsity."

Derek Rowh was chosen by Norton coaches as the Norton "Junior Varsity Wrestler of the Week". "This was Derek's first championship and I was very happy for him," said coach Miller. As usual, this regional tournament will be the toughest of the four in the state.

Six of the top 10 ranked teams in the state will be among the 23 teams competing. They are: Plainville, No.1; Norton, No.3; Scott City, No.4; Hoxie, No.5; Oberlin, No.6; Phillipsburg, No.10.

Other teams competing will be: Atwood, Ellis, Thomas More-Prep of Hays, Hill City, Thunder Ridge, Leoti, Lincoln, Oakley, Osborne, Quinter, Russell, Smith Center, St. Francis, Stockton, Sylvan-Lucas, Tribune and Trego Community.

A total of 37 of the 84 state ranked individual wrestlers are expected to compete in this regional for berths in next week's state tournament in Hays.

The top four finishers in each



Wrestling will continue Saturday at 11 a.m. with the consolation cross bracketing, followed by the consolation quarterfinals at 1 p.m., consolation semifinals at 3 p.m.; consolation finals (two mats) at 5 p.m. and championship finals (one mat) at 6:30 p.m.

Plaques will be awarded to the top two teams and medals to the top four wrestlers in each weight.

Admission is \$5 for K-12, \$6 for adults, Friday; \$7 for K-12, \$8 for adults, Saturday.
