# Lady Jays season ends with loss in Sub-State

nortontelegram@nwkansas.com The No. 3 seeded Norton Community High School girls basketball team played hard as always but just did not hit enough baskets in a 52-27 loss to No.2 seed Ellsworth in the semi-finals of the Class 3A Sub-State Basketball Tournament played Thursday in the NCHS Stull Gym in Norton.

The loss ended the Lady Jays' season with an overall record of 12-10.

Ellsworth moved on to play No.1 seed Russell in Saturday's championship finals and their season ended with a 14-9 record when they lost to Russell by a score of 55-37.

Russell will enter the Class 3A State Tournament in Hutchinson this week with an 18-5 record.

Norton got off to a slow start against Ellsworth and trailed 19-6 after one quarter. In the defensive second quarter, both teams scored just 5 points but Norton still trailed 24-11 at

Norton's best quarter was the third when they scored 12 points but the Lady Bearcats tallied 13 to hold a 37-23 advantage. Ellsworth finished strong, outscoring Norton 15-4 in the final

"We dug ourselves a hole in the first quarter and just could never get out," said Norton head coach George Rossi.

"We played hard but Ellsworth has a good team. We never gave up but they were the better team tonight.

"It's sad to see the season end with this loss but you must remember that only one team will finish this season with a win."

Norton's six points in the first quarter came on a basket from beyond the arc from senior point guard Tawni Griffey, a two-point basket by junior guard Katelyn Engelbert and a free throw by junior post Bailey Ambrosier.

The five points scored by Norton in the second period came on a three-point basket by junior guard Johnnye Ruder and a two-point basket by Ambro-

In the third quarter, Griffey found the range on two shots from beyond the arc while senior post Alec Melvin, senior guard Kamilla Jones and Ambrosier each hit two-point bas-

Engelbert and junior guard Marisa Maddy hit Norton's only fourth quarter baskets.

Leading scorer for Norton was Griffey who hit all 9 of her

points on 3 of 7 treys for 43 per-

Halle Connally led Ellsworth with 19 points. Brenn Cravens added 11.

As a team, Norton hit just 4 of 16 from beyond the arc for 25 percent, 7 of 21 two-point tries for 33 percent and 11 of 37 overall for 30 percent.

Ellsworth scored on 4 of 6 from long range for 67 percent, 17 of 38 two-point attempts for 45 percent and 21 of 44 overall for 48 percent.

From the free throw line, the Lady Bearcats hit 6 of 11 for 55 percent. The Lady Blue Jays shot just 3 free throws and hit 1 for 33 percent.

Norton grabbed 5 offensive and 15 defensive rebounds for 20 total. Ellsworth pulled down 6 offensive and 19 defensive caroms for 25 total. Leading rebounders for Nor-

ton were Katelyn Engelbert and Bailey Ambrosier with 5 each, followed by Tawni Griffey, 3; Katie Bohl, Johnnye Ruder, Kamilla Jones, 2 each; Alec Mel-

Griffey was credited with 3 of Norton's 5 offensive assists. Engelbert and Jones had 1 assist

Norton had 2 steals and Ellsworth had 7 steals. Melvin and Jones each had 1 theft.

The Lady Jays had 14 turnovers and the Lady Bearcats lost the ball 8 times.

Norton will lose three seniors off this season's team: Tawni Griffey, Alec Melvin and Kamilla Jones.

"Our three seniors have been awesome leaders," said coach

"I'm proud of our players. We got a lot better during the season and improved in all areas.

"We had a huge crowd screaming for us again tonight. Our fan support has been really great all year.
